Our Letters from Germany Eay, that a great and general Dyet of the States of the Empire, where the Emperon will be in perfon, will be held very fuddainly, as is betheved at Nurenberg.

Heqgue, Deg., 5 . We are expeeting the return of the Depaties of the States of Folland againgt Tnefday next, when they are to re-alfemble. The Minifler of the Elector of Cologne, has given in another Memorial to the States, concerning the evan cuating of Cafal and Mafeyck, in the Countrey of Liege, which arefiill poffelt by the Troops of this ptate. The flate ff che War fyr the next year, as it is agreed on by the Prince of Orange, and the touncyl of State, is now before the Srates-General, who have ordered the fame to be fent to the feveral Provinces for their approbation. The Heer Boreel, one of the Ambaffadors of this State in France, has d:fired leave to return house, which is granted $1 \nmid m$.

- Ealmoulh, Dec, 8. Ycfterday the Wind coming about to the Weft, Forty or Eifty fail of Merchant Ships that were in this Harbor, bound home fiom France and other parts, failed from hence.

Dudlin, Ded. 6. LaR night Mr. Phunkett, Titular Primate ofthis Kingdom, was feized, and likewife committed prilener to the Caftle.
-The Lord-I iequtenant has ordered reverad detachments to befent out, of Horfe and EOOr, to arifl the Countrey people, to that up all the Avenates and Paffes of the Boges and Mountains, which Hanland, an odd Torys, ufes Eo, Hant, in order to teut cut thet race of Robbers.

Whitebal, Dec.ri. The Juftices of the Peace for AIIdllefex and we ftminfler, (who were appointed to attend His Majelty in Council this day) being calded ing refeived a flriet charge to put the Laws agaiuft Papitts, with a regard to Merchant-Atrangers, and Forrcign-Travellers, in execution; and a direction that they;fhould meet together to confult of fuch expedients, as fhould occure to them, fur the effectual executing His Majefties late Proclamation (Commanding all Papilts forthroith to depart tie Cities of London and Wel:minfter, \&c.) and that they fhould make their report to the Lords* of the Privy Council, whom His Majefly has appointed a Committer to receive the fame, as well as to confider of the xays and methods, which their Lordfhips fhall think moft effectual for the due and punctual executing of the Laws againft $\mathrm{Pa}_{-}$ pilts.

Wbitebal, Dec. 13. This morning arrived here Mr. Sbere, Surveyor General of the Mole at Tangiex, to give His. Majefty an account of the flate of things there. We underftand that on the 3 paft, the Moors appeared with a conficierable Army, and encamped near Tangier ; and a day or two after, began to make formal approaches for the attacking the Forts. That on the 6th. the Englifh made two Sallics, and beat the Moors out of their Frenches. That on the 7 the ${ }_{2}$ Vice-Admital Herbert came afhore wittr 3 so Seamen, part of which with a detachment of the Garrifon, fallied out the rext morning, bcacthe Enemy from their Trenches, and did confiderable execution upon them. The fames, Ann, and Keredal Forts, had been abandoned by order of the Governor, as not being Tenable, the Soldiers that were there, retreating without any lofs, to the Town. That on the 1 g th, the Moors were very quict. And that the igth they marched off again; the Alcayde that companded them, returning to Alcazar.
