Lubon, Nov. 30. In our last we gave you an account of the meeting of the Cortes, composed of the Clergy, the Nobility, and the Deputies or Procurators of 92 Cities of this Kingdom, and of Goa in the Indies, and of Baye in Brazile; and now we can tell you, that the latter have agreed to dispense, for this time only, with the Law of Lamego, which forbids the marrying of the Infanta with a Forreigner, and have fent to the Clergy and to the Nobility to know their minds thereupon.

Copenhagen, Dec. 23. Two days fince, the King gave Audience to the Marquis de Mortaigne, Ambailador from France, who arrived here some days before. He has been fince to visit the principal Ministers, to whom, as we understand, he has made Overtures of a Defensive Allyance between his Master and this Crown, which such other Princes and States as shall desire it, may likewise en-ter into, for the mutual desence of their respe-ctive Kingdoms and Countries. What Answer has been given to the said Ambasfador we do not know, farther than that in general he has been affored of this Kings readiness to embrace all occasions to sir ngthen the present Friendship between the two Crowns. The King of Smeden is at present at Christianstadt, where he has appointed the States of the Provinces of Schonen, Halland, and Bleking to meet, to fettle the affairs thereof. We are now expecting the arrival of the Suedes Ambailador, who is to come and fetch the Royal Bride.

Hamburg, Jan. 2. The Duke of Holstein's Commillioners at Copenhagen, with the ashitance of the French Ambassador, have obtained order for the withdrawing such Danish Troops which remain in that Dukes Councries, as also a considerable abatement of the Contributions required from them, upon which the Duke is gone to his ordinary Residence at Gottorp. The King of Denmark has displaced several of his great Officers, to wit, the Admiral, and Stadtholder of Copenbagen, being two Brothers, their names Bieike. The King of Sueden we are told, to enrich the Crown, is going to re-assume all the Donations alienated from it by his Father and Queen Christina; and that his two great Favourites Feldt-Marshal Coningsmark, and the Sieur Guldensterne, have already refigned to him large possessions given them by that King or Queen. The said Feldt-Marshal (who is now Governor-General of Pomeren) having taken possession of all the Towns in that Country, and all others along that Coass, except Wismar, which the Dance have not but it's probable his main design is to promote

Most Christian Majesty, out of his great respect and good will to his Electoral Highness, made him the offer of a Princess of bis own Blood in Marriage. 2. That for a greater Testimony of that good will, and to advance the Electors Glory, in case he had thoughts of becoming Emperor, and in order thereunto chosen King of the Romans, bis Majefly would not only affift him with bu good Offices, but with bis Services also to compass that design. 3. That the King, to make the Union closer between him and the Elector, desired his Sister in Marriage for the Dauphin. To which the Ravarian Ministers replied, 1. That both the Elector and the Lady offere: h.m were too young to speak, as yet of their Marriage. 2. That the Elector was very well contented with the Estates and Monours he posfessed, and had noddesign of encreasing them. 3. That they were ready to enter into Negotiation concerning the Treaty of Marriage between the Dauphin and the Princess. The French continue their Levies in these parts, and Monsieur la Roche, who is principally employed therein, Lists none but such as have served formerly, and are of good strength of body.
