Genoua, Dec. 21.

HE Nonfucb and Centurion Frigats, which have been fo long expected, are not yet arrived; but we have advice of fix Ships that have been feen off of St. Remo, flanding to the Eaftward. Our Letters from Marfeilles give an account, That 8 Galleys were fitting out there, being defigned hither, to try if our Senate will, upon fecond thoughts permit them to Winter in their Arfenal.

Genouz, Fan. 3. Not any Ships have arrived here these Holydays; neither have we as yet any-News of the Centurion or Nonsuch, so that there is Insurance upon them at 4 per Cent. This Senate is sending an Envoy Extraordinary for France, to represent to that Court the reasons that have induced them to refuse the leave which was demanded for the French Galleys to Winter here.

Marfeilles, Fan. 3. Eight French Galleys are fitting out here, with all diligence, for Genoua. The chevalier de Valbelle is failed with 3 Men of War from Thoulon for Tripoli, to endeavour to oblige that Government to a Peace. The Argierises plave of late taken 11 or 12 French Veffels, fome of them very rich.

*Venice*, *Dec.* 22. Prince *Radzeviile* the Polifh Ambaffador continues at *Pontieba*, and will do fo till an Express he has fent to *Poland* be come back. In the mean time this Senate has let him know, That they cannot give the Crown of *Poland* any Affiftance against the Turks, feeing it would draw a new War upon them, who have not yet recovered what they fuffered in the last, nor paid the -Debts they then contracted.

Dantzick, Dec. 25. It is about a year fince that great diffurbances happened here among the Commonalty, in the hear of which they fell upon the Carmelize Friers, offered fome Violences to their perfons and plundered their Choilter, which might have gone farther, but that the Care of our Ma-gistrates put a flop to the dilotder, some of the Ring-lead.rs being committed to Prifon, who were afterwards all dilcharged except two or three of the m ft culpable. The King of *Poland* referted the th ng highly, writ a Letter to our Magistrates, requiring them to punish exemplarily the Authors of this Riot, and to make latisfaction to the Friers; but nothing was done thereupon, and in this flate this matter has ever fince continued, which is now brought upon the Board again; for the laft week came hicher the Weywode of Pomeren, in quality of the King of Poland's Commissioner, to examine this matter, and to require Juffice to be done upon the Offenders; and we are told that our Magistrates, to fatisfy the King, have refolved that the Criminals that are now in Prifon shall be brought to condign punishment.

Hamburg, fan. 5. The Danes have not yet eva-cuated Wijmar, on account of fome Aricars Contributions that reman, owing to them. Counc Conningfmark, Governour General of Pomeren for the King of Sueden, continues fill here, and will do fo till the Moneys which are to be remitted hither from France are ready to be paid to the Duke of Zell, who upon payment thereof will reflore to him the Dutchies of Bremen and Verduns The Bilhop of Ofnabrug, who was on his way to Italy, is, upon the News of his Brother the Duke of Hanouer's death, coming back to take possession of that Dukes Territories, which, in purfuance of a contract made between the three Brothers, fall to him; and when the Duke of Zell, who has only one Daughter, which by the Laws of the Empire has no Right of Succellion, comes to dye, the Bilhop of Ofnabrug, or at leaft his Son, will become yet more confiderable by the acquifition likewife of what that Duke is now possefield

Straburg, Jan. 2. These Parts are full of Complaints against the proceedings of the French, who have not yet suffered the poor Linhabitants to enjoy any effects of the Peace, but on the contrary continue to oppress them with those exective Contributions they now demand of them, and particularly of the Country of Brilgow. The Suffe Cantons are extreamly concerned that, notwithstanting their repeated inflances at the French-Court to the contrary, the Fortifications at Himmingen are fill continued, and will be fuddenly. finished, which they look upon to be intended for a Bridle upon them.

Hague fan. 12. To the Memorials of the Imperial and Cologne Ministers demanding the Evacuation of Haffel and Maleyck, the States have Answered, That they are ready to comply with his Eledoral Highnes's define therein, provided he give this State fatisfastion in the pretentions they have upon him, as well on account of the Contributions and of what his Electoral Highnes's comes to the Inhabitants of Deventer and Swol for Merchandizes bought of them, at of the exactions made on the faid In! Abitants, at the time those places were evacuated by that Electors Troops, contrary to the express Articles of the Treaty of Peace. From Wessel they write, that the French would fuddenly quit the Dutchy of Cleves, but that they protended first to have paid them 2 19000 Crowns. The Elector of Brandenbutg has given the Government of that Country, which Prince Maurits of Naffam, lately Decealed, had, to the Electoral Prince his Son.
