Swanzey, April 8.

He Black Mary, a Bark of this place, bound with Coals for Plymouth, was lately, with a Barnstable Veffel, feiled on off the Lands-end by a French Pickaroon ; the Mafter of the Back was permitted ndeen his Veffel; but the Privateer waiting for his return, discovering a Sail making towards him, which he guest to be one of our Men of War, left his two prizes to go on drift, which by Boats fent out, were fecured, having loft onely tome Provisions and Cloaths, and the Master of the Barnstable Vellels raken prifoner.

Edenburgh, April 9. This day Gideon Murrey, a stout Privateer, came into Leith Road, bringing in with him five final Prizes; he had at Sea a lufty dispute with two great Ships, which held the greatest part of a day, but the Ships tondantly relieving one another, he was forced to leave them

and return home.

All hands are at work upon the Danish Fleet, but 'tis not believed they can equip above 10 of them Winft the time appointed.

From Norway we are advised of the fad condition of that Countrey, where the meaner fort of people fuffer infinitely for want of Corn and Trading. Five of the Danish Men of War lie in Bergen, and two in Fleckery, all of them ill

manned, and worfe victualled.
