Lubon, Decemb. 12.

HE three Eflates of the Cortes have approved of the Marriage of the Infanta with the Duke of Savoy, and have therefore confented to the difp ning with the Law of Lamego for this time only. The faid States are very much concerned at the Interdict which flill continues upon the Inquifition, by which means the Jews that are now Prifoners cannot be brought to their Tyals, and divers Propofals have been made on this fubject in the feveral chambers, which have not hitherto taken any effect.

Genoua, Jan. 17. The 11th inflant arrived here the Referve, Richard Boucher Matter, from Marfeilles; and the 14, eight French Gallies, commanded by the Sieur de Manfe they were fuluted with four Guns from the Foit, and with as many from the Patron Gally of this State, which the French returned with the fame number: but not bling able to obtain p rmificon to winter in the Aricnal here, they tailed again yefterday morning for Legarn and Civita Vecebia. The Centurion and Nonfuch Frigats as yet appear not; but by the way of Legorn we have a lvice, that they were failed from Alicant for Oran, to carry fome Monies thither for the Spaniards and that the Newfoundland Convoy was put into Cadiz; fo that it's hoped the one and the other will not now be long wanting.

will not now be long wanting. Prague, fan. 13. From Hungary we have an account, that 500 Imperial Horfe had revolted, and were gone over to the Poles, taking their Horfes and their Arms with them, which was occasioned by the difcontent they were in for want of their Pay. The Duke and Dutchels of Saxe-Lawenburg are retuined hither, and we expect the El ctoral Prince of Savony who intends to pais the Carn.val here. It is faid that the Emperor is going to fend Count Lamberg in quality of his Envoy Lxtr.ordi. ary to England. V. e have advice from feveral parts that The Fr nch are endeavouring to make the Dauphin King of the Remans; and, we are told, that this as well as other confiderations makes the Emperor defire to hav a perfo. al Conference with the Eiectors and other Prisces of the Empire, and that in order thereunto he had writ to them to repair to Ratubonne, where he would meet them; but that they have answered, That they are so impoverished by the late Wars, that they are not able to furnish the expence of such a Fourney, or come attended as became their Dignities.

Hamburg, Jan. 21. The Duke of Zell has received Bills of Exchange for 100 thousand Crowns from France; fo foon as they are paid, Careifladt, and feveral other places in the Dutchy of Bremen, will be reflor d to the Suedes; but becaufe the Bailage of Tedingbuysen is by the Treaty of Peace, to remain to the Duke of Zell, the Velt-Marshal Coningfmarke is at Bremen, to treat with the Bifhop of Munfter about his parting with the faid Bailage, which he is now polfeffed of. The difference between the Elector of Brandenburg and the Duke of ZeB, concerring the formers quattering his Troops in the Country of Mecklenburg, is not, yet determined; but on the contrary we are told that the Elector is fending five Regiments more thither; and that Monficur Chauvet General of the Duke of ZeB's borces, will in few days pass the Elbe with two Regiments, and march towards Mecklenburg, and that more Troops will follow him, in order to the diflodging the faid Brandenburgers.

Bruffels, fan. 21. His Excellency being very much diffatisfied with this City for its backwar. nefs to confent to the Subfidies by him demanded, as well as upon other accounts, temoved the Aflembly of the states of Brabant to Vilvord, and declared that he would go and refide in fome place in Flanders, but his Excellency was afterwards prevailed with to recal the faid States back hither. The preparations which we hear from feveral parts the French are making, fill us with apprehenfions of their defigns, and give his Excellency caule the more vigoroully to apply himfelf for the putting these Provinces into a poflure of defence. The flanding Force which has been agreed by the feveral Provinces to be kept on foot, confifts of \$5000 Foot, and 5500 Horfe. That part of them; which are maintained by the Province of Flanders are very well paid, and are in a good con-dition, but the like cannot be faid of those in the other Provinces. We are informed that the French are drawing a Body of men together near Tournay; a d that there are already 10000 men in that Neighborhood. The French fet up daily new Pretentions, which do not a little difquiet us here. It feens the Prince is of Lillebonne pretends that her Brother the Prince de Va demont is owing to her 400 thousand Florins; and we under and that the Moff Christan King has undertak n to procure her fatisfaction herein.

B uffels, Jan. 28. On Saturday last the Count de Monbran retuined for Tournay. I aving this C net in great perpl xity concerning the affair of Charlemont : and this day the Count d'Archino , one of our chief Ministers was dispatched by his Excellency to Cologne, to endeavor to perfuade that Hector to part with Dinant; and at the fime time an Exprefs was fent to Madrid to inform the King of this matter. Deputies are come hith r from Ghest, and the Country of Waes, to represent to his Excellen cy the great damage they have fullained by the high Waters, which have broke through the Dikes in feveral places. Our letters from Strasburg give us an account, that they are preparing for the reception of the Dauphinefs, whom they expect there about the middle of the next month with a Train of 350 perfons.

Anglerdam, Febr. 2. The great concern and di con le of people here of late has been concerning the Alliance proposed by the French Ambasfador at the Hague; the matter was warmly debated, and all the Arguments that could be used pro and con, flifly infilted on, but at last the States, to the great latistaction of all people, have purlued their true Intercit, and refolved not to embrace the Propofals of the French, who have carried this matter to high as to feem to threaten us with little less then a War, in cale the States refused the laid Alliance, which they have now done.

Hague, Jan. 30. The States of Holland adjourned themfelves lost Wednefday till the 6th of the next month, having first unanimently refolved, as we told you in our last, to reject the Alliance proposed by France; and ordered their Deputies to declare the fame in the Affembly of the States General, from whom the formal Anfwer to the French Ambaffadors Propulate on this subject must come; and in order thereunto this matter will now be brought before the other Provinces in their refpective Affemblies, who, we may be confident, will follow the example of Holland. In the mean time we are rold that the French Amballatlor gives out, That he feall be very fuddenly called home, and that the King his Master will order all his Subjects to quit the Service of this State. Notwithstanding which the p ople are extremely pleafed with the Refolution the States of Holland have taken in this important Affair. And molt of the Foreign Minilters have repeat d their Complinents to Mr. Sidney upon his fuccels therein. The Deputies of the States, an 1 those of the Admiralties have agreed upon the building of 18 Men of War, for the firen, then-ing their Naval Force. They have likewile refolvel to fend fome Forces to Surinam to put that Colony into a poffure of defince. The El ctor of Brandenburg has fignified to the States General that he has a defign to buy 200 pieces of Cannon in this Province, and defires their leave for the trai forting of them; which they have taken into confideration. The Sieur Van Zit er is defigned Ambassador to the King of England in the 100m of the Sieur Van Leeuwen, who has defired to be, recalled.

Hague, Febr. 2, The Spanish Minister here has prefeated a Memorial to the States General, wherein he acquaints them with the demand mad, by the French of having Charlemont delivered to thim by the 25th inftant; and we are told that the States have refolved to write to their Ambalfadors in *France* about this matter. The Prince of *Orange* went yesterday morning to Soefidike, to divert himfelf with Hunting for four or five days. From Amfterdam we have an account, that Monfieur Van Beuningen late Ambaflador from this State in England, is cholen one of the four Burgermalters of that City for this prefent year.

Paris, Febr. 3. On Monday last the Princess of Tingry, the Dutchefs of Bouillon, and the Mareschalle de la Ferte, appeared before the Chamber, according to the Summons they had received, and after examination, were difmift again. The Duke of Luxemburg is removed from the Bastile, to Viny an Express from Bavaria we have ad-Cennes. vice, that the Ceremony of the Marriage between th. Whitehall, Jan 26. Whitchall, Jan. 28. " His Maje fly was pleafed this afternoon to declare in Council, that He had lent for his Royal Highnels, not baving found such an effect from his absence, as should encline him to keep him longer from Him. That some Questions had been started of late of such a nature, and of sogreat Concern to the Duke, as made it reasonable to have him present at the next Selfions of Parliament, and that though His Majesty would take care to preferve his Right, yet it might be for his fatisfaction to be here himself. That His Majesty was so well assured of the Dukes Compliance, that He could answer his return should have no ill influence upon the Publique.
