THE King and Queen of polaxd, after a long abfence are expected here the 8th inflant, and on the 12 th will be Begun the conrocation or great Council, which is appointed to be held. Few of the Senators are yet arrived, but the reft are all on their way. From Mofcovy we are affured that the Czar has laid afide all thoughts of Peace with the Torks, and is refolved to purfue the War with all the Vigor poffible, and that he is fending Ambaffadors hither to engage this Crown to joyn with him in it.

Madrid, $f a n$, io. The Queen makes her publick Entry into this place on the 13 inflant, which will be performed with great State and Magnificence. We are told that a confiderable fupply of money is ordered to be fent for Flanders; from whence we hear that the Proceedings of the French begin to make people fomewhat aneafie.

Prague, fan 20. The Emperor refolves, as we underitand, to. continue here till Eafler, and then it's faid he will go to Egra in Bobemia to be prefent at a general Mufter of his Troops that are in thefe parts, which fome feem to think there may be occalion to employ, efpecially if what wehear of the Levies and ocher preparations which the French are making, be true.

Berlin, fax. 24. Yefterday Lieutenant General Spaen parted from hence for Cleves, to give the nuceffary Orders upon the French leaving thatCoun ry, which we are affared they are now going to do. Our Electur is at prelent at Pojfdam, very much indifipofed with the Cout.
strasburg, fan 30. The Fiench not being plealed wih the Fortificationsthey have been making at Hunningen, are, as we are told, going to de.nolifh them, intending to make them of a larger extcnt. They will likeosile fortifie Landaw and Croon-Weifenberg, and other places in thefe parts. In the mean time the french do not fuffer any Corn to be carried to Bafle.
Francfort, February 1. Monfieur Colbert the French Ambaflador has not yet finifhed his bufinefs at the Court of Bavaria, there remaining one main point undetermined: The French would have it lipulated That in cale of Failure of an HeirMate of the Line of willam Doke of Bavaria, the Succeffion of that Dukedome fhould devolve to the Son of the Duphin by the Princeff he is now goingto Marry, if he have acy, which the Eavarian Minifers will by no means agree to; and this, it's faid, is the Realon, why the Ceremouy of the Marriage, which would otherwife have been performed 'ere this, is deferred. We are told, that the-States of the Empire, upon the repeated Complaints made to thrm of France's contravening the Peace, have tefolved to pray the Emperor to call a General

Dyet, where fuch Refolutions may be taken, as are neccliary for the fafety of the Empire.
Colvgne, Feb. 2. The firft inflant dirrived here from Mankeim the Rbingrave, natural Sor of the Elector Palatine, and the Count de Scomberg, Son of the Marefchal of that name; they were both entertained yefterday at dinner by the Bilhop of Stresburg, and this day they both parted again from hence, the firfl for Eugland, and the other for France. Yefterday came hither from bruftels the Count d'Arcbinto, who is going to the Emperors Court in quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the Crown of Spain: he will flay here fome days to treat with our Elector concerning Dinant, which fome people perfuade themfelves he may yet be prevailed upon to part with, notwithfanding the French Envoy here does all he can to hinder it, It is very confidently faid that the French will quit wefel the sfth. Inftant's, but many are fo incredulous that they will not believe the French are in earnell till the fie it done.
Liege, Feb. 3. The Cardinal da Bouillon arrived here two days fince, and was received by our Magiffrates with great refpects. He pretends to be chalen Coadjutor to the Bilhop of Liege, and offers in that cafe to reunite Bonillon to the Bifhoprick of Liege; and it's probable he may fucceed therein, if the Elector of Cologne, our Biihop, does defire a Coadjutor, which he has hitherto on the contrary been very averfe to, as well with relation to this Bihhuprick as the Archbifhoprifk of $\mathrm{CO}^{-}$ $\log n e$, in which the Prince of Newoburg and the Biihop of Strabburg are pretenders to the Coadr jutor!hip.
Brufels, fan. 30. The EleEtor of Cologne has fenc a Minifiter to refide here, who has aflured his Excellency of his Matters guod intentions towards thefe Provinces, and of his readinefs to embrace any Propofition that may conduce to their Peace and fecurity, and particularly of his willingnefs to comply with his Excellencies defires as to Dinant, upon fiuch conditions as fhall be found reafopable; but that not only the confent of the Stares and the Chapter of Liege, and that of the Emperor and Empire, but likewife the approbation of the Pope muth be had before he can part with that place, which is the Patrimony of the Church. But this cannot be done in the time limited by the Frenct: Yet this is not the only matter which perplexes this Coutt; for the French give it daily frelh occafions of difquict: We are now informed that they have given notice to L: fines, Ninde, and Grammoxt (upon which the French have fet up a pretention) that they intend to lend Troops to guarter there, the like they have done to Nivelle, Hall, and Engbien Monficur Saiirdis, Comnander of the French Troops at $W e f e l$, has fent to the Marquis of Rbisberg, Governor of Gueiderland to let him know, that he mult pafs through that Country with $T_{A}^{\prime}$ Troops in thrir return to France, ant
to defire that notice may be given accordingly to the Villages where the is to quarter in his March. We have advice thit the French Troops in Bur$g$ ady and Lorrain are moving, that fome march towards \#iedmont and others towards AISdce, having with the m Cannon and Mortar Peices. From Treves we have an account that leveral Troops raifed for the French in Germany had palfed by that City in their March for France.

Brafélf, February 6. His Excellency has deferred his going to Gaunt till after the arrival of the next Spanifh Courier ; by which he not only expects a confiderable Sum of Money, but likewife Orders. to make a Reform in the feveral Councels, and the Chambert of Accounts, which ate to be reduced to a much fmaller number, then they confilt of at prefent. A great Misfortune has happened to the Country of waes, which puts thofe Inhabitants to great Charges. The Great Dyke being lately bruken through by the Waters in 47 feveral places, which entangered the overflowing of the whole Country. The Frerch are pieparing to quit Dizant, and have fent to the Elector of Cologne to acquaint him therewith. The Countefs de Soifons is arrived at Namur.

Amplerden Feb. 6. From Utrecht we have an account that the states of that Province are feper ratud, having firtt relolved not to enter into the Allya ce now offered by Franez; and lent Orders accordingly to their Depucies in the Alfembly of the $S$ ates General; whither it's believed the advices. of all the other Provinces upon this matter will 10 b be brought in few days. From Flanders they write that the French are drawing a Body of men together near Tournay.

Hague, feb. 6. This day the Deputies of the Provirices of Utrecht, Gueiderland, Frifeland, Over. Jhe, and Groningen, in the affembly of the States Gegeral, gave in the advices of their refpective Primcipals concerning the French Allyance, which did all of them concur, with the refolution of the States of Holland, not to enter juto the faid Alliance. This day likewife the- Scates of Holland reaffembled, But feveral Depuries not being as yet arrived, they adjourned till to morrow wirhour entring upon any bufnefs. The laft Night dyed here Colonel Colliers. From Hamburg they write; That the French are upon the point of making an Alliance wich the two Northern Crowns, and that Prince Geirge the Kieg of Denmark's Brother is to marry with a French Lady.

Weymoutb Fizanary 30.' Laft night a fmall Veffel, called the Litlle Fobn of Bcurdeaux, laden with Winss for Dutthirke, was forced alhore by extrenity of Weather, near Porthand, all the Men being faved.

Tarmouth, Feb. 2. Four of His Majefties Yachts, bound for Scotland, are now at an Anchor in this Road. They were on Saturday as far to the Northwards as wells, but were forced off to Sea by a Fiolent Storm, and yefterday came into this Road.

Deale, Fetruary 1. The laft Night we had a moft violent Storm, in whith, three fmall Veffels were forced alhore, two of them being bound home from $O$ Porto in Portugal: And fome other Ships are miffing.

Deale, February 3. The Weather has been very Tempeftuous, and in it feveral Veffels have been caft away upon the Goodrin, and near this place.
