Brussels, Feb. 9. We are told, That the French are making great preparations, That the Marschal d'Humiers has given Orders for the reinforcing all the Foot Companies, and adding Sub-Lieutenants to them, which were reformed when the Peace was made; That a Camp for 25000 men is marked out near Valenciennes, and that 16 Battalions and several Squadrons are come to Mabeuge, which place the French are fortifying, and will make more considerable then Charleroy. From Liege they write, That in all appearance the Cardinal de Bouillon will be chosen Coadjutor to the Bishop of Liege; they add, That the French intend to demolish Dinant before they quit it. In the mean time we are expecting the return of the Courier which was sent to Spain about the affair of Charlemont, who undertook to go and return in 18 days. The Ministers of Zell and Osnabrug do extremely press his Excellency to liquidate the Sums due to their respective Masters for the Subsidies. The Governors of Ideth, Courtray, Audenard, and Charleroy have sent to pray his Excellency, That they may be Provided with all things necessary for their defence. From Venice of the 26th past they write, That the Senate was somewhat allarmed at the account they had received of the French Troops passing daily down the Po in small numbers (to avoid suspicion) towards Casal; which place they conclude to be Sold to the French. That the State of Genoua had remitted Moneys to Naples to make considerable Levies in that Kingdom, being more than ever jealous of the designs of France.
