and the Pillaw, whither he has fent fome very ingenious perfons to fet up a Yard for building of Ships, and doing other things, which according to all probability, will be of great advantage to himtell and his Subjects.

Hamburg- March 12. There is at prefent very little to be written from hence. By our next it is probable we shall be able to tell you that the Suedes areagain Mallers of Stade: In the mean time they are not well pleafed with the many difficulties that have been made by the Duke of Zell to delay the evacuation. The Corps of the late Duke of Hanquer are brought to Calenburg : the Troops of that Frince have all taken Service with the Bifhop of Ojnabrug, who has now eight Regiments of Foot and four of Horfe under the Command of three General Officers.

Strasburg, March 9. The French continue to make great Magazines, and to encrease their In-fantry by new Levics: We are told that 4000 Horfe, and much about that number of Foot, are to be drawn out of Lorrain and the Bishopricks of Metz, Toul, and Verdun, to joyn the Sieur Biffi, who has at present a Body of Men under his Command, with which he is to keep the Field, for the fecuring the men that are in feveral places working on the new Fortifications that are making. In the mean time people here begin to be every day more and more uneafie, for till we fee the French Arms comployed fome other way, there is reafon enough to apprehend that the deligns of that Crown are upon Germany, and particularly upon this City. From Lorrain they write, That the most Christian King had reftored to the Prince de Vaudemont the Earldom of Bitsch, referving to himself the Soveraignty of it.

Bruffels, March 20. The French flart every day new pretentions upon fome place or other: for belides Ginet and Agimont, whereof we told you in our laft, they now pretend to the Soveraignty of Beaumont and Lveral Villages thereunto belonging; and we have an account that they have polfeffed themfelves of to Villages in the Chafteline of Aeth, pretending that they belong to Tournay. The French are Fortifying Charlemont, and intend to make a confiderable place of it.

Hague, March 16. Sir Robert Southwell, His Majefty of Great Britains Envoye Extraordinary to the Elector of Brandenburg, is arrived at Rotterdam, and is expected here thisday,

Hegue, March 19. The Prince of Orange retur-ned hither on Saturday last, fince which time the States General have drawn up a formal Answer to the feveral Memorials of the French Ambaffafor; the Subflance of which is, That in very Civil terms they declare they cannot enter into the Alliance which the Molt Christian King has been pleafed to propole to them. The Bifhop of Munfer, under fanding that it was reported that he was entred into fome new Engagement with France, he has by his Minister here assured the States of the contrary, and that he is refolved to live in a perfect Friendship with them. Sir Robert Southwell, who arrived here on Sunday last, has "been to wait upon the Prince and has had Conferences with the Minillers of feveral Princes of the Empire upon the Subject of his Commission,

Hague, March 22. On Monday next Sir Robert Southwell continues his Journey for Berlin. From Hamburg we have an account that Stade was delivered up to the Suedes the 13th Inflant, and that the Duke of Zell is to keep Boeckboede and the Lands thereunto belonging, till the reft of the

200000 Crowns are paid. Swanzey, March 11. The Wefterly winds continue lo violent here, that feveral Veffels who have been in this Port almost these three months, cannot yet flir. On Tuesday last was put in here a Portuguese Veffet, bound for London; the Malter in-forms us, That on the 27th path, being off of the Rosk' of Linbon, he faw a great many English Veffels making to that Port, and that speaking with one of them, he was informed that the Ships with their Convoy, bound for the Streights, were paft by.

Deal, March 14. There are now about 100 Sail of Merchant Ships in the Downes, outward bound, who are waiting a fair Wind.
