Geucral havirg writ to th: Reveral Provinces to communicate to them the adrice of the (ouncil of State concerning the building 36 Men of War, and the demand they made of Mony for that lervice; the States of Holland have approved the fame, and have refolved forthwith to raife their Proportion of the Sum required. The Stat.s of Holland have likewife agreed to the State of the War for this prefent year, as it has been formed by the Prince of Orange and the Council of Sate, nithour making any alteration therein. Notwhifanding all the inftances of the Cologne Minilter, the States are refolved not ta part with Mafeycke and Haffetr, till they have fatisfaction from that Elector, which is a matcer that may occafion fome difference between them, and the rather for that thePrince of Orarge has fent orders to the Garifons in thole places, to lumman in the neigh. bouring Country to pay their Arrears of Contribations, and in peratale thereof to proceed to Military execution. And on the other fide the Elector of Cologne, to whom thofe places belong, as -Bifhap of Liege, has commanded his Subjects not to pay the fard Contributions; and that in cafe Farce be employed againft them, they do refilt the fame with Force. The Lard Bodmyn, the King of Englond's Envoy Extraordipary to Denmark, has fince his arrival here waited upon the Prince, and received the Vifits of molt of the Foreign Minifters; ard it's believed hisLordfhip willin a day or two purfue his journy to Copienbigen. The Princefs of Grange has been very ill of the Chollick, but her Highnefs is 25 prefent much better, and ina fair way of recovery, Licutenant-General 'Spaen contipues ftill here to follicite the payment of the Arrears uf Subyidies, which the Elector of Brandenburg his Maftecs, pretends to be due to him from this state.

Pendennis, March 22. On Saturday lafti a fmall Vellel bound for France, failed from hence, but is fince toms again into Port, having, as the Mafter reporti, been chaced by three great Ships, which .he fuppof s to be Algierines,

Falmouth, March 22. Yeflerday arrived in this Eort a Kctch, who came from Dublin, the Malter reports, that on Saturday laft, of of the Lizard, he Was chaced by thres Turks Men of War, but that by keeping clofe to the fhoar, he efcaped them, and that afterwards meering with fome Engliih Veffels, he gave them notice thicreof, who thercupon put into the firt Port they could make. But this day came in a fmall Veffel from Wales, the Mafter fays, that feveral Veffels came out in his company, and that they were beating it two days botween the Lands-end and the Lizard, the Wind at Eaft, before they could get into this Port, and that they ncither fawnor heard of any Turks Men of War. Yefterday pait by this place a great Eleqt of Merchant Ships to the Weftward.

Plimouth, March 23. This day His Majeflies Ship the Ruby, put into this Port, to take fuch Merchant Ships, as were here, under her Convoy; but came not to an Anchor, making the belt of her way. The Leopard and Forefght are hourly expeßted.

Deale, March 25. This day arrived in the Domones from the River of Tbames, the Williamfon, Captain Bafle Commander, the Foanna Captain Bendal, and the Lancafter Captain Goodland, all three buund for suratte.

Deale, March 27. Yefterday the three Eaf frdia Ships failed out of the Downes, the Wind at N. N. E.

Whrteball, March 27. George Speke 'Efq; Mr. Fofas, Anfis, Mr. Richard Fobrifon, Mr. Samuel Key, and Mr. Fenry Key, of Somerfethire, attending the Council this day upon an Accufation of dang, rous and feditious Words, by them fpoken, tending to the diftorbance of the Peace and Quict of His Ma* joflies Government; and being heard as to their defence thereunto, it was ordered that Mr. Speke and the other perfons abovementioned do give in good fecurity to appear and anfwer to fuch information as thall be exhibited againft them for the faid Offences, hy His Majêties Attorney-General, who is ordered to Profecute them.
