talors, but licherts they have not agreed upon the method of doing it, which has made them Adjourn till I riday next, that they might consult their Principals once more in this Affair. The Dutch Commissary, who Resides at Arguers, has let the States know, That the Peace lately concluded will have no effect till those People receive the Guns the States promifed them. Thefe States are fending a Minister to Spain and a oth r to Venice, and to the Princes of Italy. The Princess is almost perfectly recovered, and it's believed the Court will go out of Town presently after Easter. From Ratis-bonne we are informed, That the Elector of Cologne had, by his Minister there, presented a Memorial to the Dyet, Complaining that these States contitue to keep from him his Towns of Haffelt and Maseyck, and praying their assistance in Order to the recovering of th.m. Sir Gabriel Si.vius will continue his Journey, the beginning of the next Week, to the Court of the Princes of Lunenburg.

Paris, April 6. The first Instant the Count Bagliani. Envoy from the Duke of Mantoua, had a private Audience of the King; the donjectures are that it was about the Affair of Casal, but they are Conjectures only, for after all, no certain account can as yet be given concerning this matter, the Truth of which is kept very fecret, and for the general Discourses they are not to be relied upon. The Letters from Bruffels speak of a promotion of Cardinals, and give us a List of their Names, but our Letters from Rome and other Parts of Ita'y make not any mention thereof, io that we look upon it as a mislake, for if any promotion had ben made, this Court would certainly have as early Notice thereof as any other.
