HIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Mr. Quarme, the Yeoman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majefly's Commission for declaring His Royal Affent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act to revive and continue, until the Firft Day of May, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-eight, an Act paffed in the Seffion of Parliament holden in the Thirty-fixth and Thirty-feventh Years of His prefent Majefty, Chapter One hundred and two, videlicet, on the Nineteenth Day of July, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-feven, for granting to His Majefty additional Duties on Diffilleries in the feveral Parts of the Highlands of Scotland therein particularly deferibed, for a limited Time; and for regulating the Duties on Diffilleries in the refpective Diffricts in Scotland.

An Act to enable His Majetty more effectually to provide for the Defence and Security of the Realm during the prefent War; and for indemnifying Perfons who may fuffer in their Property, by fuch Meafures as may be neceflary for that Purpofe.

An Act to continue, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand feven hundred and ninetynine, an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the Thirty-fixth and Thirty-feventh Years of His present Majesty, Chapter Seventy-fix, videlicet, on the Sixth Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-feven, for difallowing the Bounty on Sailcloth or Canvas, the Manufacture of Great Britain, exported to Ireland.

An Act to continue feveral Laws relating to the granting a Bounty on certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported, and taking off the Duties on the Importation of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax,

until the Twenty-fourth Day of June, One thoufund feven hundred and ninety-nine ; to the permitting the Exportation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from this Kingdom to the British Sugar Colonies or Plantations in the West Indies, until the Twenty-fourth Day of June, One thousand eight hundred and two; to the allowing the Importation of Rape Seed, and other Seeds used for extracting Oil, whenever the Prices of middling British Rape Seed shall be above a certain Limit, until the Twenty fourth Day of June, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-nine; to the further Sup-port and Encouragement of the Fisheries carried on in the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights, until the Twenty-fifth Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-nine; to the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain until the Twenty-fourth Day of June, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-nine; to the afcertaining the Strength of Spirits by Clarke's Hydrometer until the First Day of June, One thousand eight hundred and one; and fo much of an Act made in the Thirty fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for better securing the Duties on Glass, as was to continue for a limited Time, until the Fifth Day of July, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine.

An Act to revive and continue, until the Conclufion of the prefent War, an Act paffed in the Seffion of Parliament holden in the Thirty-fixth and Thirty-feventh Years of His prefent Majefty, Chapter One hundred and twenty five, videlicet, on the Nineteenth Day of July, One thoufand feven hundred and ninety-feven, for authorizing His Majefty to permit the Exportation of an additional Quantity of Wheat and other Articles to the Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey and Alderney.

An Act to prevent, during the War, Perfons, refiding or being in Great Britain, from advancing Money or Effects for the Purchafe or on the Credit of Debts owing to the Government of the United Provinces, or any Bodies Politic or Corporate, or any Perfons within the faid Provinces, without Licence for that Purpofe; and for extending the Provifions of an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, more effectually to prevent, during the prefent War between Great Britain and France, all traiterous Correfpondence

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with, or Aid or Aflifance being given to; His Majefty's Enemies, to the faid United Provinces, and to the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government therein, and also to the Perfons, Territories and Places under their Government.

An Act to amend Two Acts, made in the Twentyfixth Year of King George the Second and the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majeity, respecting the Performance of Quarantine; for punishing Persons acting contrary to any Order in Council which may be made for laying an Embargo on Ships or Veilels, or for prohibiting or regulating the Exportation of any Goods, Wares or Merchandize; to prevent the fraudulent Importation of Glafs into this Kingdom; for permitting the Removal of Coffee and Cocoa Coattwife, for the greater Convenience of Exportation; to authorize the Commissioners of the Cultoms to return the Duties paid on Goods imported, which shall be lost or destroyed before the Landing thereof; to prevent Veflels licenced by the Admiralty from being engaged in any Trade or Employment not permitted by their Licences; for permitting Wines put on Board any of His Majesty's Ships to be removed from one Ship to another without being first landed and warehouled; and for extending the Provisions of an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty to Wines delivered into the Charge of the Collector and Comptroller of His Majelty's Cuftoms at the Port of Falmouth.

An Act for increasing the Rates of Subfiftence to be paid to Innkeepers and others on Quartering Soldiers.

An Act for making Compensation to the Proprietors of certain Lands and Hereditaments purchased in pursuance of an Act made in the Thirtyfourth Year of the Reign of his present Majesty, for better fecuring His Majesty's Batteries and other Works in the Counties of Kent and Devon, and to certain Owners and Occupiers of Lands who have fustained any Loss or Damage in confequence of the faid Act.

An Act for paying, repairing, cleanfing, lighting and watching the Highways, Streets and Lanes in the Town and Port of Hythe, and Liberty thereof, in the County of Kent, and for removing and preventing Nullances and Annoyances therein.

An Act to amend an Act made in the Twentyfourth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majetty, for building a Bridge over the River Oufe, at Newhaven in the County of Suffex.

An Aft for enlarging the Powers of the Company of Merchants of the City of Edinburgh.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament, the Term, and amending the Powers of Two Acts refpectively, made in the Twentyfixth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, and in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for repairing the Road from Penrith to Chalk Beck, with a Branch from the faid Road upon Caftlefowerby Pafture to Caldbeck, all in the County of Cumberland,

An A& for continuing, for the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of an A& pafied in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for repairing and widening the Road from a Place

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament, the Term, and enlarging the Powers of Two feveral Acts paffed in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, and in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for repairing the Road from the Town of Cirencefter to the Town of Stroud, and that Part of Rodborough Hill, which leads to Dudbridge; and alfo the Road leading from Cirencefter towards Bifley, fo far as the Bottom of Gulph Hill, all in the County of Gloucefter.
