AT the Court at St. James's, the 25th of April,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promise and de clare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or

by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this inflant April; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this instant April to the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive: - Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majeity's Order in Council of the 4th Day of November last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom of any Sort of Rock Salt, will expire upon the 29th Day of this instant April: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said 29th Day of this instant April, export or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or load or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Sort of Rock Salt whatfoever, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituied, " An Act for indemnifying all "Perfons who have been concerned in advising. " or carrying into Execution an Order of His " Majesty in Council respecting the Exportation " of Rock Salt; for preventing Suits in confe-" quence of the same; for authorizing His Ma-" jesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coastwife of Rock Salt; and for making further " Provisions relative thereto;" His Majesty, nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, that nothing herein contained shall prevent Rock Salt being carried Coastwise, under the usual Rules, Regulations and Restrictions, nor the Exportation of the fame to Ireland, or to any other of His Majetty's Dominions, under the usual Conditions and Regulations, and upon Security being given, by the Exporter and Two other Persons, (of whom the Master of the Vessel shall be one) by Bond, in such Penalty as shall be directed by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cultoms, that the faid Rock Salt shall be exported to some Port or Place in His Majesty's Dominions, and none other; and that a Certificate shall be produced within Six Months from the Date of the Bond, if fuch Rock Salt shall be entered out for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, and within Twelve Months if for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in America or the West Indies, and within Eighteen Months if for any of the British Settlements or Factories in Afia or Africa, under the Hand of the Principal Officer of the Customs at the Port or Place where fuch Rock Salt shall be so landed; and if there shall be no Officer of the Customs, then under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place, tellifying that the faid Rock Salt has been duly landed at the Port or Place for which the fame was entered out. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. Copy of a Letter from the Right Hon. Admiral Lord Bridport, K. B. to Ewan Nepean, Esq; dated on Board His Mujesty's Ship Royal George, at Sea, the 22d Instant.

SIR,

Have the Satisfaction to acquaint you, for their Lordships Information, that L'Hercule, of 74 Gons, was taken by His Majesty's Ship Mars last

Night.
The inclosed Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Butterfield will best shew to their Lordships the Spirit and Judgment manifested upon this Occasion. Praise of mine can add one Ray of Brilliancy to the dultinguished Valor of Captain Alexander Hood, who carried his Ship nobly into Battle, and who died of the Wounds he received in supporting the just Cause of his Country. It is impossible for me not to sincerely lament his Loss, as he was an Honor to the Service, and univerfally beloved; he has fallen gloriously, as well as all those who are so handsomely spoken of by Lieutenant Butterfield. I have appointed him to the Command of L'Hercule, to carry her into Port, and I have given a temporary Appointment to Captain James George Shirley to command the Mars, and Lieutenant George White, First of the Royal George, to command the Megæra. Lieutenanant Henry Combe, the Second, will deliver to you this Dispatch.

My Lord,

Beg Leave to acquaint your Lordship, that the Ship chased by His Majesty's Ship Mars Yesterday, per Signal, endeavoured to escape through the Passage du Raz, but the Tide proving contrary, and the Wind Easterly, obliged her to anchor at the Mouth of that Passage, which afforded Captain Hood the Opportunity of attacking her, by laying her fo close alongfide as to unhinge fome of the Lower Deck Ports, continuing a very bloody Action

for an Hour and a Half, when the furrendered.

I lament being under the Necessity of informing your Lordship, that His Majesty has, on this Occa-sion, lost that truly brave Man, Captain Hood, who was wounded in the Thigh late in the Conflict, and expired just as the Enemy's Ship had struck her Co-This Ship proves to be L'Hercule, of 74 Guns and 700 Men, her first Time at Sea, from L'Orient, to join the Brest Fleet.

I cannot fufficiently commend the Bravery and good Conduct of the furviving Officers and Men, who merit my warmest Thanks: I must particularly recommend to your Lordship's Notice Mr. Southey, the Signal Midshipman.

Lieutenants Argles and Ford are the only Officers wounded. Captain Hood and Captain White, of the Marines, are killed. Lieutenant Argles, though

badly wounded, never quitted the Deck.

From a Number of the People being with Lieutenant Bowker, in Charge of the Prize, I cannot at

prefent

present inform your Lordship the exact Number of 60th Ditto, Hospital Mate Philip Mulheran to be Killed and Wounded, but from the best Information Assistant Surgeon. Circumstances lasford, I think about 30 killed and as many wounded, most of them dangerously.
