A<sup>T</sup> the Court at St. James's, the 25th of April, 1798,

RESENT. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS His Majefty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majelty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promise and de clare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefly's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen fhould be taken for His Majefty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or

by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majetty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this infant April; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this infant April to the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive :-- Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-

VV jeity's Order in Council of the 4th Day of November laft, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom of any Sort of Rock Salt, will expire upon the 29th Day of this inflant April: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition thould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this inflant April, export or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or load or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried
