PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Order in Council of the 4th Day of November last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this inftant May : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inflant May, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, trans-ported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, port Ach or Board Ach without Lower on Boa any Pot-Ash or Pearl.Ash, without Leave or Permillion being first had and obtained from His Ma-jetty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majelty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been concerned in adviling or carrying into Exe-" cution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of " His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation " of Pot Afhes or Pearl-Afhes ; for preventing Suits

extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Ar-ticles to Ireland, or to His Mujefty's Iflands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Satk or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or ot His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give sull and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuttoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Pond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord War-den of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertan.

#### Westminster, May 10, 1798.

" His Majefty's Treafury respecting the Exportation " of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits " in confequence of the fame; for authorizing His " Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coastwife of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for " making further Provisions relative thereto." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to " HIS Day the Lords being met, a Metfage was fent to the Honourable House" of Commons by Mr. Quarme, the Yeoman Uther of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by wirtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assessed upon by both Houses, do defire the immediate.* Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of *Peerd*  the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords *Peers, to bear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for granting to His Majesty additional Duties on Salt.

An Act for granting to His Majesty an additional Duty of Excise upon Tea, and for repealing fo much of an Act made in the last Session of Parliament as charges a Duty of Five Pounds per Centum upon Tea imported into or fold in Great Britain.

An Act for repealing the Duties on Houfes, Windows and Lights, on inhabited Houfes, and on Clocks and Watches, and for granting to His Majefty other Duties on Houfes, Windows and Lights, and on inhabited Houfes, in Lieu thereof.

An Act for repealing the Duties upon Male Servants, Carriages, Horfes, Mules and Dogs, and for granting to His Majefty other Duties in Lieu thereof.

An Act to prevent, during the War, Perfons, refiding or being in Great Britain, from advancing Money or Effects, for the Burchale or on the Credit of Debts owing to any of the Governments in Switzerland, or any Bodies Politick or Corporate, or any Persons therein, without Licence for that Purpole; for extending the Provisions of an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, more effectually to prevent, during the present War between Great Britain and France, all Traitorous Correspondence with, or Aid or Assistance being given to His Majesty's Enemies, to Switzerland; and also the Provisions of an Act made in the Thirty-fourth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for preventing Money or Effects in the Hands of His Majefty's Subjects, belonging to, or disposeable by any Persons resident in France, being applied to the Use of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, and for pre-ferving the Property thereof for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof, to the United Provinces, and to Switzerland, and to the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government therein, and also to the Perfons, Territories and Places under their Government.

An Act to enable His Majeffy to call out a Part of the Militia in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; and to amend an Act made in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An Act to raife and embody a Militia Force in that Part of the Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland.

HE following Addrefs having been tranfmitted by the Lord Advocate of Scotland to the Duke of Portland, His Majefty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been by his Grace prefented to the King; which Addrefs His Majefty was pleafed to receive very gracioufly.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Addrefs of the Minifters and Elders, in their Synod affembled, of that Body of Diffenters from the Church of Scotland, commonly called Burgher Seceders.

May it please your Majesty,

WE your Majefty's very loyal and dutiful Sub-jects, the Members of the affociate Synod of Presbyterian Diffenters, deeply fensible of the Bleifings of a Conftitution which fecures to all their Civil and Religious Rights, and of the Virtues of a Sovereign, who for to many Years has been an Example to his People, can no longer contemplate in Silence those awful Dispensations of Providence, under which fo many Governments have been shaken and overturned, and a great Military Power raifed in the Centre of Europe, which, after menacing Conquett and Revolution to all around, it now feems to direct it's concentrated Animofity and Violence against these Realms, threatening with final Ruin all that has been there accumulated by the Efforts of Ages, for the Comfort and well being of Man; and at the fame. Time labouring infidioufly to unnerve their Inhabitants, by diffeminating and promoting Difaffection to your Majefty, Aversion to the Constitution, and Hostility to the Faith of the Gofpel.

At fuch an eventful Period we beg Leave to lay at the Foot of your Majefty's Throne our humble Affurances, that we will unite in the general Effort which the Nation muft now make for preferving it's Exiftence; and that we will, in the Congregations under our Paftoral Charge, zealoufly use that Influence which, under the mild and equal Laws of our Country, we enjoy, to roufe them to a Senfe of their prefent Danger and Duty, and to recall to their Remembrance the Examples of Attachment to the illustrious House of Hanover, which their Fathers in the Seceffion have fhewed in former critical Emergencies; and while we call on them to look to that God who holds in his Hand the Definy of Nations, and

and to truft in his fuperintending and gracious Providence, we will urge them to act like Men who have to contend for all that is dear to them, and to preferve from formidable and inveterate Foes themfelves, their Families, their Poffeffions, and thofe invaluable Inftitutions which, according to their refpective Natures, have proved the Sources of Civil Liberty here, and, we truft, the Means of eternal Salvation hereafter.

We humbly befeech your Majefty to accept these Affurances of our constant and inviolable Fidelity, of our Abhorrence of every traitorous Confpiracy, as contrary to the Holy Scriptures,' and our avowed Principles, and of our fincere and fixed Resolution to exhort all within the Sphere of our Influence to perfevere in their Duty and Allegiance.

Sire, we will not ceafe to pray, that the God of our Lord Jefus Chrift, the Father of Glory, may encompafs your Majefty with his Favour as with a Shield; that he may abundantly blefs your Majefty's Royal Confort, the Prince and Princefs of Wales, and all the Royal Family; that he may fanctify to all your Subjects the prefent alarming Difpenfations of Heaven; and that he may crown with Succefs the Exertions of your Majefty's Navy and Army, for fecuring us from Invafion, and thus laying a Foundation for your Majefty's negotiating an honourable Peace.

SIR,

Have the Satisfaction of enclosing, for the In-I formation of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter I Yesterday received from Lieutenant Price, Commanding Officer on the Islands of St. Marcou, in which it will be found, that, by his firm and steady Relistance, against a very confiders able Force, those Islands have been faved falling into the Hands of the Enemy.

The calm Weather had for fome Days prevented His Majesty's Ships under my Orders from checking the Progrefs which the Flotilla from La Hogue might attempt to make, and, judging from the Information I received from Lieutenant Price on the Morning of the 6th, that it was on it's Way to the Islands, I necessarily approached them as near as the State of the Weather would permit me to do: On the fame Afternoon, however, I was obliged to anchor, but, taking Advantage of a light Breeze in the Evening, I again weighed and flood in. At Ten o'Clock that Night, it again falling quite calm, and fearing the Flood Tide would carry us too far to the Eaftward, the Ship once more anchored, the Islands bearing W. by S. Six Miles.

A little before the Dawn of Day the Enemy | commenced the Attack, and the Boats were foon afterwards feen placed, and the boars were join afterwards feen placed, and keeping up a conflant Fire. A light Breeze fpringing up at that Time from the N. N. W. with an Libb Tide, the Signal was made to weigh, and Captains Talbot, of the Eurydice, and Haggett, of the Oreftes, were directed by me to fland in as fast as possible, and attack the Enemy in the Manner they should judge moit effectual towards deltroying them, on arriving While going down, however, it was perceived up. the Enemy was making his Retreat in a very hafty and confused Manner, and I am not altogether without Hope, that the near Approach of His Majelly's Ships in fome Meafure confirmed the Enemy in his Inclination of abandoning an Enterprize, which, from the very able Conduct, and well-directed Fire of Lieutenant Price, he would, at all Events, have been ultimately obliged to do. It again falling calm, and the Ships not having Steerage Way, rendered Porfuit on our Side impoffible, and enabled them to

make their Retreat to La Hogue. It would be great Injustice in not joining with him in his very well beitowed Commendation on the Conduct of the feveral Officers and Men under his Command.

It may not be deemed improper to mention, that I this Morning faw fome Pieces of Paper taken from the Veffel which has been towed in, and that among ft them there is a Sort of Return of the Crew, by which it appears that it confifted of 144 Men; the total Force, therefore, may have been very con-fiderable, and there is every Reafon to believe has fuffered great Lofs.

I Beg Leave to represent to you, that in confequence i of the Information I received Yefferday, and the Movements of the Enemy at La Hogue, I conjectured they would attack us in the Night, about high Water, I therefore difpatched a Guard Boat, belonging to the Sandfly, with Mr. Moore, Midshipman of the Eurydice, in her. to watch the Motions of the Enemy. About Twelve o'Clock he got among ft them, and made the Signal of their being in Mo-tion, and about the fame Time we clearly heard the Enemy talk, but it was fo dark we could not difcover them.

SIR,

At Day-Break I observed their Line drawn abreast of the S. W. Face of the Western Redoubt, and having all my Guns I could bring to bear well pointed, I began a fteady well-directed Fire on them, until the flat Boats came within Mufquet Shot, when I obferved Six or Seven of them go down, whilft the others took out the living Part of the Crews; one I am towing into the Iflands, and the Remainder, confifting of 43, are returning into La Hogue. I am clear, from the crouded State of their Decks, that they must have received great Damage and Slaughter; but I am forry to add, we had Marine killed, and three feverely wounded, and one one' Seaman wounded.

Copy of a Letter from Lieutenant Charles P. Price, dated on Bourd His Majesty's Gun-Vessel Badger; Istes St. Marcou, the 9th of May, 1798, to Evan Nepean, Efq.

I Beg Leave to reprefent to you, for the Information of my Lords Commiffioners of the Ad-miralty, that, on the 6th Instant, observing the Enemy forming their Gun-Boats and Flats in Divifions in the Road of La Hogue, I confidered it a certain Appearance of an Attack, and ordered every Perfon to remain under Arms to receive them ; I, at the fame Time, fent a Guard-Boat off the Mouth of La Hogue to watch their Motions. Mr. Moore, Midshipman of the Eurydice, who commanded the Boat, acquainted me, by Signal, about Twelve P.M. of their approaching us, and foon after we heard them diffinetly giving Orders to the Men; but the Night being very dark, and calm, we could not fee them. At Day-Break I observed them in Line, drawn a-breath of the South-Weft Face of the Weftern Redoubt, and having every Man in Readinefs, I opened a brifk Fire, of Seventeen Pieces of Cannon, on them, when they immediately returned the Fire from Fifty-two Gun Brigs and Flats, for Two Hours and fome Minutes. The Gun Brigs remained to batter within about Three or Four Hundred Yards; and the Flats rowed up to us with great Refolution until they were within Musker Shot, when our Guns, loaded with Round and Grape, or Cafe, for about One Hour, cut them up in Chips before they could retreat ; and our Fire on the Boats attempting to fave thole finking, must have occasioned great Slaughter, as they were crowded with Soldiers for the Purpofe of florming us. I conjecture, from the fmall Flat, No. 13, I have towed in Bottom up having 129 of the 2d Company of the Battalion of Boulogne Marine on Board, that there were Six or Seven Thoufand Men embarked; and of the Fifty-two that began the Action, I could discover only Forty-three able to retreat.

Lieutenant Bourne took every Method in his Power to affilt me, but from the Situation of the Attack the East Island was deprived for fome Time of doing much, but with the Shells from the Sixtyeight Pounders over the Length of the Weft Island, but latterly did them great Damage, by flanking the North-Weft Face of the Weft Ifland.

I am pleafed to acquaint you, that Lieutenans Enfor, who commands the Party of Marines under Lieutenant Bourne took every Method in his Enfor, who commands the Party of Marines under Power to affift me, but from the Situation of the my Command, behaved, with his Men, in a very Attack, the East Island was deprived for fome Time ; extraordinary good Officer-like Manner, having the whole

whole Face of the Redoubt to attend to. Lieutenant Maughan, with a Detachment of Twenty-two Marines, lent me from the Adamant, commanding the Two detached Guns and a Blockhoufe, did great Execution; and it is impossible for me to describe the fleady good Behaviour of Serjeant Henderson, with the Nine Artillery Gunners, Marines and Seamen.

I am forry to announce the Death of Thomas Hall, private Marine, killed; Richard Dunn and Peter Williamfon, Marines, wounded, and Thomas Banks, Seaman, wounded.

But confidering our receiving the Fire of near So heavy Bow Guns, from 30 to 18 Pounders, for upwards of two Hours, I look upon our Damage We had four Guns difmounted, but as not great. I got them fit for Service before Night.

Enclosed I fend you Lieut. Bourne's Letter to me, the Morning after the Action.
