tices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Con-
stables, and all other His Majesty's loving Subjects,
to use their utmost Diligence in apprehending the
said Lord Edward Fitz-Gerald.

GOD save the KING.

AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 2d of May,
1798.

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's
Order in Council of the 4th Day of No-
vember last, prohibiting the transporting into any

Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ash or Pearl-
Ash; (except as in the said Order is mentioned)
will expire upon the 7th Day of this instant May;
And whereas it is judged expedient that the said
Prohibition should be continued for some Time
longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice
of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit
and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever
do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months;
to commence from the said 7th Day of this instant
May, export, or attempt to export, transport,
carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any
Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, trans-
ported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom,
any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Per-
mission being first had and obtained from His Ma-
jesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring
the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the
Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled,
"An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have
been concerned in advising or carrying into Exe-
cution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of
His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation
of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits
in consequence of the same; for authorizing His
Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying
Coastwise of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for
making further Provisions relative thereto." But
it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing
herein contained shall extend, or be construed to
extend, to prevent the Exportation of the said Ar-
ticles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of
Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His
Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the
West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's
Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to
the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements
or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon
the Exportation of the said Articles to Ireland, or to
His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney,
Sark or Man; or to His Majesty's Colonies and
Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the
Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts
and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the
Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or
Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the
said Articles do first make Oath of the true Desti-
nation of the same to the Places for which they
shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the
same

same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that about Eight o'Clock on the Evening of Tuesday the 3d Instant, as John Mellish, Esq; accompanied by Two other Gentlemen, were returning to London, in a Post-Chaise, from Salt Hill, they were attacked by Two or more Footpads near the Magpies on Hounslow Heath; and that before and after robbing these Gentlemen, the said Footpads had the Turpitude to fire Three Pistols into the Chaise, a Ball from one of which entered the Forehead of the said Mr. Mellish, and soon afterwards deprived him of his Life.
