P R E S E N T, The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 4th Day of November laft, prohibiting the transporting into any

Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot Afh or Pearl-Afh, (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this inflant May: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice. of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholoever. do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inftant May, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, tranfported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl Ash, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Ma-jesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled; An Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have " been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in confequence of the same; for authorizing His " Majefty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coaftwife of Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes, and for " making further Provisions relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or or His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame

fame shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo centered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commifsioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appettain.
