WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that an anonymous Letter was, on the 10th of April last, received by Mr. John Annable, a Coaftwaiter in the Service of the Customs at the Port of London, and another anonymous Letter was addressed to Mr. Ralph Carr, who is an Evidence for the Crown in a Prosecution now depending in the Court of Exchequer against Myer Jacobs, a Jew; which said Two Letters were sent by the Penny Post, and delivered at the Yorkshire Grey Public House, in Beer-Lane, Thames-Street, of which the following are Copies, viz.

“ Sir
“ If You bring Carr into Court against M. Jacobs and he is Cast You may depend upon it we will do for Carr and to be plain We will Shurley take his Life the first opportunity, hope You will take this as a warning”
