PROCLAMATION,

For ap rebending Robert Watfon.

GEORGE R.

7 HEREAS Robert Watson, late of Spa Fields, in the County of Middlefex, commonly called Doctor Watson, itands charged with Sufpicion of High Treason; We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend the faid Robert Watson, otherwise Doctor Watfon (who is about Five Feet Three Inches high, Thirty-three Years of Age, grey Eyes, high Forehead, dark Hair, bald on the Top of the Head, very thin, of a fallow Complexion, marked with the Small Pox, looks old for his Time of Life, and is lame of the left Leg; was born at Elgin in North Britain, and speaks a strong Scottish Dialect, was convicted at the Old Bailey in November, One Thoufand feven hundred and ninety four, of publishing a feditious Libel, and received Sentence of Imprifonment for Two Years in Newgate), and to carry him before fome of Our Juffices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively rehe shall be apprehended, who are respectively re-quired to fecure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice to Our Privy Council, or One of Our Prin-cipal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forth-coming, and may be dealt withal, and proceeded against according to Law: And whoever shall difco-ver and apprehend the faid Robert Watfon, other-wice Defore further and bring him before such her wife Doctor Wation, and bring him before fuch Juftice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate, or so discover him that he may be apprehended, fhall receive a Re-ward of FOUR HUNDRED POUNDS; which faid Sum of Four Hundred Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-third Day of May, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-eight, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

ISPATCHES, of which the following are Copies, have been received from His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland by his Grace the Duke of Portland, His Majefty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

#### Dublin Caftle, May 24, 1798.

My Lord,

THE Intelligence contained in my last Dispatches must have prepared your Grace to hear of some Attempts being made by the Rebels to carry their traitorous Defigns into Execution before every Poffibility

fibility of Succefs was defiroyed by the vigorous but at prefent I am not furnified with regular Re-Measures which have lately been purfued.

For fome Days Orders had been iffued by the Leaders of the United Irifhmen, directing their Partizans to be ready at a Moment's Notice, as the Measures of Government made it necessary for them to act immediately. Yesterday Information was received, that it was probable the City and the ad-jacent Diffricts would rife in the Evening; fubfequent Information confirmed this Intelligence. In confequence of which, Notice was fent to the Ge-neral Officers in the Neighbourhood, and Dublin was put in a State of Preparation. The Meafures taken in the Metropolis prevented any Movement whatfoever, but I am concerned to acquaint your Grace, that Acts of open Rebellion were committed in the Counties of Dublin, Meath and Kildare. About Half past Two o'Clock this Morning, there ivas a regular Attack made by a Rebel Force upon the Town of Naas, where Lord Gosford commanded, with Part of the Armagh Militia, and Detachments of the 4th Dragoon Guards, and Arcient Britons. The Rebels confifted of about a Thousand Men, armed with Muskets and Pikes, and they made their Attack with Regularity, but were foon repulfed by the Armagh Militia, and then charged, and purfued by the 4th Dragoon Guards and Ancient British, and I understand their Loss amounted to near 200. Two Officers and a few Privates have been loft of His Majeity's Forces. It gives me pain to relate that a fmall Detachment at the Town of Profperous has been furprized, and a Detachment at the Village of Clare cut their Way tor Naas, with fome Lefs. There was also an Attack on a small Party of the oth Dragoons, near Kilkullen, which fuffered ; but in the Courfe of the Day, General Dundas was enabled to come up with a confiderable Body of the Rebels near the Hills of Killcullen, where they were entirely routed with the Lofs of Two Hundred Men. There were alfo feveral Bodies collected laft Night in different Parts near Dublin, which were attacked by the Rathfarnham Cavalry, and by a Detachment of the 5th Dragoons, and difperfed with fome Lofs and fome Prisoners and Horfes were taken. A Rebel Party however affembled at the Borders of the County of Dublin, near Dunboyne, and overpowered fome Conftables, and afterwards took the Baggage of Two Companies, guarded by a fmall Party of the Reay Fencibles, coming to Town, and have, during the Courfe of this Day, committed many outrages, feveral of them however have been killed, but the Body remains undifperfed. The City is tranquil, and I have no doubt will remain fo this Evening, and I truft that To-morrow we shall entirely difperfe that Body of the Infurgents which has not been entirely routed To-day.

I must add, that the Mail Coach going to the North was attacked, within a few Miles of Dublin, by a felect Body, well armed; the Paffengers were taken and the Coach burned. The Galway Mail-Coach was also attacked in the Town of Lucan, but the Rebel Party was driven off before its Destruction was effected.

In confequence of this desperate Conduct of the Rebellious, I iffued the inclosed Proclamation, with the Advice of the Privy Council.

I shall in a future Dispatch detail to your Grace the particular Services which have been performed,

Extract of a Letter from Lord Viscount Gosford, Colonel of the Armagh Militia, and Major Wardle, of the Ancient British Light Dragoons, to Lieutenant General Lake, dated Naas, Thursday Morning, Eight o'Clock, 24th May, 1798.

THIS Morning about Half paft Two o'Clock, a <sup>1</sup> Dragoon from an Out post came in, and in-formed Major Wardie, of the Ancient British, that a very confiderable armed Body were approaching rapidly upon the Town. The whole Garrifon were initantly under Arms, and took up their Pofitions according to a Plan previoufly formed, in cafe of fuch an Event happening. They made the Attack upon our Troops, pofted near the Gaol, with great Violence, but were repulfed. They then made a general Attack in almost every Direction, as they had got Possession of almost every Avenue into the Town. They conti-nued to engage the Troops for near Three Quarters of an Hour, when they gave Way, and fled on all Sides. The Cavalry immediately took Advantage of their Confusion, charged in almost every Direction, and killed a great Number of them. A great Quantity of Arms and Pikes were taken ; and within this Half Hour many Hundreds more were brought in, found in Pits near the Town, together with Three Men, with Green Cockades, all of whom were hanged in the public Street. We took another Prisoner, whom we have spared, in consequence of his having given us Information that will enable us to purfue thefe Rebels; and from this Man we learn that they were above a Thoufand ftrong. They were commanded, as this Man informs us, by Michael Reynolds, who was well mounted, and dreffed in Yeoman Uniform, but unfortunately made his Ef-

cape; his Horfe we have get. When we are able to collect further. Particulars you shall be made acquainted with them. About Thirty Rebels were killed in the Streets; in the Fields we imagine above an Hundred ; their Bodies have not yet been brought together.

It is impoffible to fay too much of the Cavalry and Infantry; their Conduct was examplary throughout.

Extract of a Letter from Lieutenant-General Dun-das to Lord Viscount Cafilereagh, dated Naas, May 25, 1798.

IN Addition to the Account which I had the Honor . of fending you Yefterday, I have the Satisfac-tion to inform your Lordfhip, that about Two P. M. Yefterday I marched out again to attack the Rebels, who had affembled in great Force on the North Side of the Liffey, and were advancing towards Kilcullen Bridge: They occupied the Hills on the Left of the Road leading to Dublin, the Road itself and the Fields highly inclosed, on the Right. The Attack began between Three and Four; was made with

Gallantry; the Infantry forcing the Enemy on the Road, and driving them from the Hills on the Left: the Cavalry, with equal Success, cutting off their Retreat. The Affair ended soon after Four. The Slaughter was confiderable for fuch an Action; One Hundred and Thirty lay dead. No Prifoners.

I have the further Satisfaction of flating to your Lordship, that His Majesty's Troops did not fuffer in either Killed or Wounded. The Rebels left great Quantities of all Kinds of Arms behind them, and fled in all Directions.

This Morning all is in perfect Quietnefs. General Wilford, from Kil.are, joined me latt Night; an Officer with whom I ferve with unspeakable Satisfaction.

The Troops of every Deferiation, both Officers and Men, the wed a Degree of Gallantry which it was difficult to refliain within present Bounds.

Captain La Touche's Corps of Yeomaniy diffinguilhed the nfelves in a high Stile.
