By the KING, PROCLAMATION, For ap rebending Robert Watson.

GEORGE R.

7 HEREAS Robert Watson, late of Spa Fields, in the County of Middlesex, commonly called Doctor Watson, stands charged with Suspicion of High Treason; We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to discover and apprehend the said Robert Watson, otherwise Doctor Watson (who is about Five Feet Three Inches high, Thirty-three Years of Age, grey Eyes, high Forehead, dark Hair, bald on the Top of the Head, very thin, of a fallow Complexion, marked with the Small Pox, looks old for his Time of Life, and is lame of the left Leg; was born at Elgin in North Britain, and speaks a strong Scottish Dialect, was convicted at the Old Bailey in November, One Thoufand seven hundred and ninety four, of publishing a feditious Libel, and received Sentence of Imprisonment for Two Years in Newgate), and to carry him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magistrates of the County, Town or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively rehe shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice to Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forthcoming, and may be dealt withal, and proceeded against according to Law: And whoever shall discover and apprehend the said Robert Watson, otherwise Deser Watson, and being him before such Info wife Doctor Watson, and bring him before such Justice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate, or so discover him that he may be apprehended, shall receive a Re-ward of FOUR HUNDRED POUNDS; which faid Sum of Four Hundred Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-third Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.
