Difpatch, of which the following is a Copy, has been this Day received from His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland by His Grace the Duke of Portland, His Majefly's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Dublin Cafile, May 28, 1798, Half paft Four o'Clock, P. M.

My Lord,

INtelligence has been received that the Infurrection is spreading Southward, and it has broke out in great Force in the County of Wexford; and I have to inform your Grace, with infinite Concern, that the Rebels in that Quarter have affembled in fuch Force that they have cut off a Party of One Hundred Men of the North Cork Militia, who were fent to meet Colonel Foote, who has returned to Wexthem. ford, states the Numbers of the Rebels to be at least Four Thoufand, and a great Number of them Measures are taken to march against this mounted. Body, and I hope they will be met and defeated.

I have received Accounts from Colonel Campbell, at Athy, between whom and General Dundas the Communication has been stopped, that he has had partial Engagements with the Rebels; that at Monastereven and Carlow they have been defeated, and Four Hundred killed at the latter Place, and Fifty at the former. He also informs General Lake, that his Men are in high Spirits. I will not close this Letter till the last Moment of the Mail leaving Dublin, that I may give your Grace the last Information.
