AT the Court at St. James's, the 30th of May,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 6th Day of December last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Saftpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the 7th Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties, inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to impower His Ma-" jesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and " to enforce the Law for impowering His Ma-4' jesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, " or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also " to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying

"Coastwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunicion."—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's

HEREAS the Time limited by His Maj-fty's Order in Council of the 6th Day of December last, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom any of the Wood called Lignum-Vitæ, will expire upon the 10th Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His M. jetty doth therefore, with the Advice of His P.iv Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said 10th Day of June next, export, of attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum-Vitæ, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfaitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for in-" demnifying all Persons who have been concerned " in advising or carrying into Execution an Order
