French Privateer, of Four Guns and Thirty-nine Men: The Governor of Dominica having previoufly fent on Board, from Roffeau, a Detachment of Thirteen Soldiers from that Garrifon, and about Ten Seamen became Volunteers from the Mierchant Ships and Vefels, laying there, upon the Occafion.
. The Garland had One Man cilles, and Two wounded.
