THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 6th Day of December last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Ma-jefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer: His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the 7th Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Saltpe.re, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the re-spective Forseitures and Penalties, inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to impower His Ma-" jelly to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for impowering His Mai jelly to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Above Five Hundred of the Rebels were killed.

Colonel L'Estrange's Detachment consisted of Two Hundred and Thirty of the King's County Militia,
Seventeen Dragoons, and about One Hundred Yeomen. Colonel L'Estrange speaks in the highest
Terms of the Conduct of the Troops, and gives much Praise to Major Marlay, who volunteered on

the Occasion.
