The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 6th Day of December last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salepeure, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Persons whatscever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the 7th Day of June next, prelume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre. Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaff-wife, without Leave or Permishon in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Counell, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties, inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to impower His Ma-" jesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for impowering His Mai jesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying "Coaltwife of Salepetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arnis or Amaunition."—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord Frigh Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

I'ne KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 6th Day of December last, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom any of the Wood called Lignum-Vitæ, will expire upon the 10th Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command; that no Person or Persons whosever do, at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 10th Day of June next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boar, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conversed out of this wife. veyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Prity Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures in-flicted by an Act passed, in the Thirt, fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned " in adviting or carrying into Execution an O'der of the Lords Comtoillioners of His Majefiy's " Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes " or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in conse-" quence of the same; for authorizing His Majery "to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Confluide
of Por-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for making
further Provisions relative thereto." But it is
nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board any of the said Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be necessary for the Use of the said Ship or Vessel during the Course of ber inter late samp or vener earing the Course of her intended Voyage, nor to prevent the Experition of the faid Wood called Lignum Vita to Ireland, or to His Majette's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alactrey, Sark or Man, or to His Majetty's Colonies or Pitatations in America or the West Indies, or to Newtoniand and Edit Majetty's Experience of Newtoniand and Sample Sa foundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements
