Extract of a Letter from Captain Brisac, Commander of His Majesty's Ship Iris, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated at Leith, the 11th Instant.

I Have the Pleasure to say, that on the 1st Instant, off the Scaw, after a Chace of Sixteen Hours, I captured the Leger French Lugger Privateer, carrying 4 Four-Pounders, who had the Impudence to fire at His Majesty's Ship under my Command, and by the Papers I found on Board had 35 Men, commanded by a Monk. Lallemand, who, with the Crew, escaped on Shore about Three Leagues to the Eastward of the Scaw, in fishing Boats: She had taken Three Vessels, and sent them to Arundel in Norway.
