The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth

Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of August next inclusive:—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

**W**HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fourth Day of January last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Jars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued

continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Twenty-fifth Day of this instant June, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Ports and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Ports and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles

do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**T**HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for making perpetual, subject to Redemption and Purchase, in the Manner therein stated, the several Sums of Money now charged in Great Britain as a Land-Tax, from the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight.

An Act for granting to his Majesty a certain Sum of Money to be raised by a Lottery.

An Act for granting to His Majesty a Duty on Certificates issued with Respect to Armorial-Bearings or Ensigns.

An Act for regulating the Payment, until Two Months after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament after the End of the present War, of the Duties on Cinnamon, Cloves, Nutmegs, and Mace, and for granting to His Majesty additional Duties thereon.

An Act for empowering His Majesty, for a Time and to an Extent to be limited, to accept the Services of such Parts of His Militia Forces in this Kingdom

Kingdom as may voluntarily offer themselves to be employed in Ireland.

An Act to continue until the End of the next Session of Parliament, and amend an Act passed in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, Chapter One hundred and Six, videlicet, on the Eighteenth Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, for regulating the Allowance of the Drawbacks and Payment of the Bounty on the Exportation of Sugar.

An Act for repealing so much of an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Stamp Duties on the several Matters therein mentioned, and for better securing the Duties on Certificates to be taken out by Solicitors, Attornies, and others, practicing in certain Courts of Justice in Great Britain, as imposes a Duty on Licences granted to stipendiary Curates to perform the Office of Curate in any Church or Chapel.

An Act to amend several Laws of Excise relating to Coachmakers, Auctioneers, Beer and Cyder exported, Certificates and Debentures, Stamps on Hides and Skins, Drawbacks on Wines and Sweets, and Ale and Beer Licences.

An Act to revive and continue, until the 1st Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, Chapter Forty-two, videlicet, on the Thirteenth Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-four, intituled, An Act to prohibit the Importation of Light Silver Coin of this Realm from Foreign Countries into Great Britain or Ireland, and to restrain the Tender thereof beyond a certain Sum; and to suspend the Coining of Silver.

An Act for allowing Gold Wares to be manufactured at a Standard lower than is now allowed by Law.

An Act to prevent the Exportation of base Coin to His Majesty's Colonies in the West Indies and America.

An Act for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Cloathing of the Militia, in that Part of Great Britain called England, for One Year, from the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight.

An Act for augmenting the Number of Field Officers and other Officers of Militia, and for making other Provisions concerning the Militia Forces of this Kingdom.

An Act for making Allowances, in certain Cases, to Subaltern Officers of the Militia in Time of Peace.

An Act for indemnifying Governors, Lieutenant-Governors, and Persons acting as such, in the West India Islands, who have permitted the Importation and Exportation of Goods and Commodities in Foreign Bottoms.

An Act to continue, until the First Day of March, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, an Act made in the Thirty-fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act to continue and amend an Act, made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the more effectual Encouragement of the British Fisheries.

An Act for the further encouraging the Southern Whale Fisheries.

An Act for the further Encouragement of the Trade and Manufactures of the Isle of Man, for improving the Revenue thereof, and for the more effectual Prevention of Smuggling to and from the said Island.

An Act for obviating and removing Doubts respecting the holding of the Adjournments of the General Court of Quarter Session of the Peace in and for the County Palatine of Lancaster, and for authorizing the Justices of the Peace acting in and for the said County to hold an Annual General Session, and also a Special Session, for the Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for amending and rendering more effectual an Act made in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act to prevent Abuses and Frauds in the Packing, Weight and Sale of Butter, and to repeal certain Acts relating thereto.

An Act for amending an Act, made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act made in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, An Act for the due making of Bread, and to regulate the Price and Affize thereof, and to punish Persons who shall adulterate Meal, Flour, or Bread, so far as the same relates to the Affize and Making of Bread, to be sold in the City of London, and the Liberties thereof, and within the Weekly Bills of Mortality, and within Ten Miles of the Royal Exchange.

An Act for preventing the depasturing of Forests, Commons, and Open Fields, with Sheep or Lambs infected with the Scab or Mange, in that Part of Great Britain called England.

An Act for raising a Body of Miners, in the Counties of Cornwall and Devon, for the Defence of the Kingdom during the present War.

An Act for incorporating the Commissioners appointed for erecting certain Light-houses in the Northern Parts of Great Britain.

An Act for paving the Footways, and for cleansing, lighting, and regulating the Streets and other public Passages and Places within the Borough of Malmesbury, in the County of Wilts, and the Avenues leading into the same; and for removing and preventing Nuisances, Annoyances, and Obstructions therein.

An Act for making and maintaining a new Sewer upon Little Tower-hill, within the County of Middlesex.

An Act to explain, amend, and enlarge the Powers of an Act passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act for widening and improving the Entrance into the City of London near Temple Bar; for making a more commodious Street or Passage at Snow-hill; and for raising, on the Credit of the Orphans Fund, a Sum of Money for those purposes.

An Act to empower Magistrates and Justices of the Peace, in setting the Affize of Bread, to make an Allowance on Account of the additional Duty on Salt.

An Act for authorizing the Trustees therein named, to raise Money by Rates or Assessments within the Parish of Saint Peter, in the Borough and Liberty of Saint Alban, in the County of Hertford, for the better and more effectually discharging Annuities heretofore granted to certain Persons who have advanced Money towards repairing the Church belonging to the said Parish.

An Act for continuing, until the First Day of June, One thousand Eight Hundred and Twelve, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, an Act passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to prevent Frauds and Abuses in the Admeasurement of Coals sold by Wharf Measure within the City of London and the Liberties thereof, and between Tower Dock and Limehouse-hole, in the County of Middlesex.

An Act for encouraging the Art of making new Models and Casts of Busts, and other Things therein mentioned.

An Act for further continuing for Thirty-eight Years, the Term granted by an Act of the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, for continuing the Duty of Two Pennies Scots upon every Pint of Ale and Beer sold in the City of Edinburgh, and Places adjacent, for the Purposes therein mentioned, and for explaining and amending the said Act.

An Act for draining, preserving, and improving the Low Grounds and Carrs, lying in the several Parishes, Lordships, Townships, Hamlets, Precincts, and Territories of Beverley, Saint John of Beverley, Grovehill, Sandholme, Storkhill, Molecroft, Leckonfield, Arram, Scorbrough, Lockington, Ayke, Bewick, Willholme, Kilnwick, Watton, Hutton-Crawswick, Rotfea, Featherholme, Skerne, Brigham, Fisholme, Nafferton, Lowthorpe, Harpham, Little Kalk, Foston, Burton-Agnes, Granmoor, Lisset, Barmston, Ulram, otherwise Oworm, Shiplea, Dringhoe, Beeford, North Frodingham, Brandes-Burton, Moor-Town, Leven, Emmotland, Hemp-holme, Goodhill-house, and Struncheon-hill, all in the East Riding of the County of York.

An Act to alter and enlarge the Powers of an Act passed in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, an Act for building a Bridge over the River Itchin, at or near Northam, within the Liberties of the Town and County of the Town of Southampton; and for making a Road from the said Town to the said Bridge, and from thence to communicate with the Road leading from West End to Boleley, in the County of Southampton.

An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering the Powers of Two several Acts, the one passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and the other in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for amending and keeping in Repair the Roads leading from a Place called Friar Bacon's Study to Chilton Pond, and from the Top of Hinckley Hill to Foxcombe Hill Gate, in the Road leading to Farringdon, in the County of Berks, so far as the same relates to the Oxford District of the said Roads therein mentioned.

DISPATCHES, of which the following are Copies, have been received from His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland by His Grace the Duke of Portland, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

*Dublin Castle, June 16, 1798.*

My Lord,

I Have the Honor to acquaint your Grace, that this Morning Advices were received from Major-General Nugent. By these it appears, that the Rebels, who had been defeated at Ballynahinch, have petitioned for Pardon, and offered to surrender up all their Arms and Ammunition: The Major-General, in Reply, promised to accept their Submission, on the Condition of their giving up their Leader, Munroe, and the other principal Traitors who had instigated them to their late wicked Practices; they were to surrender by Twelve o'Clock on the 15th; Munroe was, however, taken by General Nugent early on that Morning.

Major-General Nugent, alluding to the Affair at Ballynahinch, states the Loss of the Rebels to have exceeded 500 Men, and that many have been since made Prisoners. The General particularly states his Acknowledgements of the Services of Major-General Barber.

He mentions, with great Satisfaction, the Conduct of Mr. Boyd, of Ballycastle. Mr. McNaghten had sent to warn him of his Danger, which induced him to retreat on Friday last to Coleraine, where he collected the Dunfevenich and Giant's Causeway Corps, with which, together with his own, he returned to Ballycastle, and beat the Rebels out of the Place; and he is now proceeding to punish them, between that Town and Glenarm.

Captain Stewart, of the Glenarm Yeomanry, and Captain Mathews, of the Portaferry Yeomanry, have behaved uncommonly well, in repulsing large Bodies of Rebels who attacked them with great Fury.

General Nugent speaks generally of the Conduct of all the Yeomanry in his District in the warmest Terms of Approbation, and mentions that he has thanked them all.

I Have the Honour to acquaint your Grace, that Accounts were this Day received from Brigadier General Barnett, stating, that on the 17th Instant, a considerable Body of Rebels attacked Kilbeggan, but were repulsed by a Detachment of Fifty of the Northumberland Fencibles, under the Command of Captain Thatcher; One hundred and Twenty of the Rebels were killed, and a great many wounded; the Detachment behaved with the greatest Gallantry.

Brigadier-General Grose reports from Kilcock, that Colonel Irwine, with a Detachment under his Command, had this Day engaged a Body of above Two thousand Rebels at Ovidstown Hill, about a Mile from Hortland. The Loss of the Rebels was upwards of Two Hundred slain.

The Number of killed and wounded of His Majesty's Troops does not amount to more than Twenty-three. Ensign Sutter, of the Inverness Fencibles was killed; Colonel Irwine was himself wounded slightly in the Cheek; Sir Richard Steele, of the 4th Dragoon Guards, was also wounded, but it is hoped not dangerously. Colonel Irwine reports to General Grose, that he is highly indebted to all the Officers and Men who served under him, and that he was much benefitted by the Assistance he received from Colonel Burrowes, who volunteered on the Occasion.

The Accounts received from the North are favourable, and state that the Rebels are dispersed in all Quarters.
