AT the Court at St. James's, the 20th of June, | 1798,

P R E SEN The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promife and de clare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefly's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefly's Service, on or before the Thirtieth

Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raile Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefly's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this inftant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward thould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order; and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant June to the Thirtyfirst Day of August next inclusive :- Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fourth Day of January latt, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anthors, Cables, Cordage, Mails, Yards, Bowiprits, Jars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty fifth Day of this inftant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued
