R ESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Founds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers applicated on Shore the raises Man for the Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-sive nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty jetty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majetty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this inftant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and

Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirtyfirst Day of August next inclusive :- Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fourth Day of January last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mass, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelly's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should he continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and com-mand, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this instant June, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Matte Varies, Boussein, Core Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Cars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forseitures inslicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enatic the His Majesty to restrain the figure trains of Na " ble His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-Reward should be continued to be paid for some I .. portation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition,
