Dublin Cafile, June 25, 1798.

My Lord, HAVE the Honour of inclosing to your Grace I the Copy of a Letter received this Day by Lord Caftlereagh, from Major General Sir Charles Afgill, and a Return of the killed, wounded and miffing by the Attack on Vinegar Hill and the Town of Enniscorthy.

Kilkenny June 24, 1798. Nine o'Clock, P. M. My Lord,

HAVE the Honour to inform yeu, that early on the Morning of the 23d Inftant, I received Infor-mation that the Rebels, amounting to feveral Thoufands, had efcaped from the County of Wexford, and formed a Camp at Killymount, and were proceeding to Gores Bridge. I instantly affembled all the Force I could collect, and marched towards them. I did not arrive in Time to prevent their defeating a Detachment at that Place, and taking 24 Men of the Wexford Militia Prifoners. They marched off rapidly
