## The Lord Lieutenant's Anfwer.

I Requeft the Houfe of Commons will accept my fincere Thanks for their Address of Congratu-If they lation on my Arrival in this Kingdom. have kindly over-valued my Succefs, they have not, I truft, over-rated my Zeal in the Service of my Sovereign. The Reftoration of Public Peace and Subordi-

nation upon Principles which may fecure their Permanence, the promoting of fuch Meafures as can beft advance the Prosperity and preferve the Constitution of Ireland, will be the conftant Objects of my Administration.

My Lord, Dublin Cafile, June 25, 1798. HAVE the Honour to acquaint your Grace that this Day Advices were received from Lieut. Gardner of the Antrim Militia, dated from Baltin-glas the 26th Instant, which state, that early in the Morning of the 25th, a very large Body of Rebels attacked his Post at Hacketstown. They were in Number many Thoulands. Lieutenant Gardner's Force confifted of 50 Upper Talbotflown, and 24 Shebagh Cavalry, 50 of the Antrim Regiment, 46 Hacketflown, and 30 Coolattin Yeoman Infantry. He at first took an advantageous Situation in Front of the Town; but, after a few Shots without Effect, the Rebels filed off in every Direction to furround him. He then retreated into the Town to defend the Barracks. A Contest took place in the Midit of Flames for near nine Hours, for the Rebels fet Fire to the Town. They were at laft re-pulfed with confiderable Lofs; many Dead were found in the Streets and Ditches, and 30 Car Loads of Killed and Wounded were carried off in their Retreat.

Lieutenant Gardner speaks in the higheft Terms of the Gallantry of his whole Detachment. He particularly praifes Lieutenant Rowan of the An-trim, Captain Hume of the Upper Talbotftown Cavalry, Captain and Lieutenant Charnley of the Coolattin, Lieutenants Saul and Thomas of the Hacketstown Cavalry, and Lieutenants Braddell and Taylor of the Shebagh Cavalry; and he ftrongly mentions the good Conduct of Serjeant Nixon of the Antrim Regiment.

He feverely laments the Lofs of a good Officer, Captain Hardy of the Hacketflown Yeomen In-fantry, who fell early in the Action. His other Loss confifts of 10 Privates killed, and of 1 Serjeant and 19 Privates wounded.

I inclose to your Grace a further Account of the Action near Gorefbridge, and a Return of Killed and Wounded, which has been received from Major-General Sir Charles Afgill.

I have no Doubt but this Victory will reftore the Counties of Kilkenny and Carlow to Peace and Tranquillity.
