By the KING, A PROCLAMATION, For the Registering of ALIENS.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An A& to continue until the First Day of August, Once " thousand eight hundred, and until the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and amend an Act, made in the Thirty third Year of the "Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens "arriving in this Kingdom, or refident therein, in certain Cafes," it is enacted, That it shall be lawful for Us, by Our Royal Proclamation or Proclamations to be iffued for that Purpose, from Time to Time, to require and command every Alien who should then be in, or should thereafter come into this Kingdom, (except as therein excepted,) to register himself or herself in the Manner therein mentioned, and thereupon to obtain Our Royal Licence to refide within this Kingdom, as therein mentioned; and divers other Provisions have been made concerning Aliens, and divers Things are required to be done within certain Spaces of Time therein limited.

And whereas by another Act, passed in the same Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to mend an Act of the present Session of Parliament, and the passed of the passed o " ment, intituled, An Act to continue until the " First Day of August, One thousand eight hundred, and until the End of the then next Sef-"fion of Parliament, and amend an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this "Kingdom, or refident therein, in certain Cafes,"
We are authorized, from Time to Time, by Our
Royal Proclamation or Order in Council, to extend the Time and Times for doing all and every the Things by the faid first-mentioned Act required to be done, within any certain Space or Spaces of Time, in such Manner as to Us shall feem sit, and to appoint any longer Time or Times for doing all and every or any of fuch Things refpectively, and to command and require the fame to be respectively done within such Time or Times as in and by Our Proclamation or Order in Council should be limited and appointed for such Purpose: Now We, being defirous of carrying into Execution the Purposes of the said Acts, in Manner heremafter expressed, do, by this Our Proclamation, by

and command every Alien who shall be in this Kingdom on the Day of the Date of this Our Proclamation (except as herein after excepted), to regifter himself or herself, within Three Wecks after the Day of the Date of this Our Proclamation, in the Manner herein-after mentioned, with fuch Perfons, and in such Districts, as herein-after are men-

tioned; that is to fay,
All Aliens refiding within the City of London shall so register themselves with the Lord Mayor of the said City:

All Aliens refiding in the City and Liberties of Westminster, or elsewhere within the Bills of Mortality, except the City of London, or residing within Ten Miles of the City of London, shall so register themselves with the Magistrates of the Seven Publick Offices, in Queen Square Westminster, Great Marlborough Street, Hatton Garden, Lambeth Street Whitechapel, Worship Street Shoreditch, Union Hall Southwark, and High Street Shadwell:

All Aliens reliding out of the Districts aforesaid, and within any Cities or Corporate Towns, or within the Jurisdiction of the Magistrates of fuch Cities or Corporate Towns respectively, shall so register themselves with the Mayor or other Chief Magistrate of each of such Cities

or Corporate Towns respectively:
And all Aliens residing in other Parts of the
Kingdom shall so register themselves with some
Justice of the Peace for the County or Place where fuch Aliens respectively shall reside.

And We do further require and command all Aliens who shall come into this Kingdom, after the Date of this Our Proclamation, to register himself or herself in Manner herein-after mentioned, within One Week after every such Alien shall have landed in this Kingdom, with the Mayor or Chief Magiftrate of the Port or Place where fuch Alien shall land in this Kingdom, or in Default of any fuch, Magistrate, with the Collector of the Customs of the Port in or nearest to which every such Alien shall land.

And We do further require and command every fuch Alien as aforefaid, for the Purpose of obtaining fuch Licence as aforefaid, to deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the Person with whom such Alien is hereby required to register himself or herself as aforesaid, a full and true Account, in Writing, of his or her Name, Age, Rank, Occupation or Profession, and where such Alien and where such Alien and the County of the the C fuch Alien last resided beyond the Seas before his or her last Arrival in this Kingdom, and when such Alien last arrived in this Kingdom, and at what

And We do hereby authorize and appoint the faid Lord Mayor, and fuch Mayors and Chief Magillrates, and other Magistrates and Collectors of the Customs as aforefaid respectively, to receive fuch Accounts as aforefaid, and do require and command them respectively to cause the original Account to be transmitted to Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for the Purpose of obtaining Our Royal Licence to reside within this Kingdom, from the faid Secretary, whom We do hereby authorize and appoint to grant such Licences, or
