If our Ship could have remained in her firt Pofition, or our.Companion could have occupied the Situation he wifhed, the Bufinefs muft have been fooner finifhed, without fo much Injury being done aloft.
:It is but Jultice to obferve that every Effort was made on board the Mermaid, during our long Chace, to approach the Enemy, and I feel much indebted to Captain Newman for heaving this Shiip off, as that was the only poffible Means to fave her. So foon as we were affoat, thieSquadron under Captain Stopford was feen in the Offing, and being called in by Signal, was of infinite Service.
