**A PROCLAMATION,  
GEORGE R.**

**W**HEREAS George James Earl of Errol was duly elected and returned to be One of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of Great Britain, and is since deceased: In order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his Room; We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holy-Rood House in Edinburgh, on Wednesday the Fifteenth Day of August next, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and chuse another Peer of Scotland, to sit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of the said George James Earl of Errol, deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall then be present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law): And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately after such Election made, and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer so elected, and sign and attest the same, in the Presence of the said Peers the Electors; and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We strictly charge and command that this Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns in Scotland, Twenty-five Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such Election. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Fourth Day of July, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

**A PROCLAMATION,  
Respecting ALIENS leaving this Kingdom and  
arriving therein.  
GEORGE R.**

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue until the First Day of August, One thousand eight hundred, and until the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and amend an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases," divers Provisions are made concerning Aliens, and it is among other Things enacted, That after the passing the said Act, it shall not be lawful for any Alien to leave this Kingdom without a Passport for that Purpose first obtained from One of Our Principal Secretaries of State; or from some Person authorized by Us to grant such Passport, which Passport is to be produced to the proper Officer of the Customs, at the Port or Place where such Alien shall embark for the Purpose of leaving this Kingdom; and allowed by such Officer, and such Passport with such Allowance is to be also produced to the Master or Person having the Charge or Care of the Vessel, in which such Alien shall propose to embark; and the Penalty of Five Hundred Pounds is imposed on such Master or Person having the Charge or Care of such Vessel, if any Alien shall embark on board the same, with his Knowledge, Privity, or Consent, not having obtained such Passport and such Allowance thereof as aforesaid; and such Alien is liable to Imprisonment for One Year, and to Transportation for Seven Years; and no Alien arriving in this Kingdom is to depart from the Place at which he or she shall have so arrived, without obtaining such Licence to reside in this Kingdom, in pursuance of the said Act, except for the Purpose of making such Declaration or obtaining such Passport, as by the said Act of the Thirty-third Year of Our Reign are required to be obtained by such Alien, or for the Purpose of delivering such Account, and obtaining such Licence as required by the said Act of the last Ses-

sion of Parliament: We, being desirous that such last mentioned Act shall be carried into Execution in the Particulars aforesaid, do hereby strictly enjoin and command all Our Officers of the Customs, and all Magistrates and other Persons, to see to the due Execution of the Act, and take care that the same be duly executed and performed under the Penalties expressed in the said Act, and under Pain of Our Displeasure.

A P R O C L A M A T I O N,  
For the Registering of ALIENS.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue until the First Day of August, One thousand eight hundred, and until the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and amend an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases," it is enacted, That it shall be lawful for Us, by Our Royal Proclamation or Proclamations to be issued for that Purpose, from Time to Time, to require and command every Alien who should then be in, or should thereafter come into this Kingdom, (except as therein excepted,) to register himself or herself in the Manner therein mentioned, and thereupon to obtain Our Royal Licence to reside within this Kingdom, as therein mentioned; and divers other Provisions have been made concerning Aliens, and divers Things are required to be done within certain Spaces of Time therein limited.

And whereas by another Act, passed in the same Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act of the present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act to continue until the First Day of August, One thousand eight hundred, and until the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and amend an Act, made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases," We are authorized, from Time to Time, by Our Royal Proclamation or Order in Council, to extend the Time and Times for doing all and every the Things by the said first-mentioned Act required to be done, within any certain Space or Spaces of Time, in such Manner as to Us shall seem fit, and to appoint any longer Time or Times for doing all and every or any of such Things respectively, and to command and require the same to be respectively done within such Time or Times as in and by Our Proclamation or Order in Council should be limited and appointed for such Purpose: Now We, being desirous of carrying into Execution the Purposes of the said Acts, in Manner hereinafter expressed, do, by this Our Proclamation, by

and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, require and command every Alien who shall be in this Kingdom on the Day of the Date of this Our Proclamation (except as herein-after excepted), to register himself or herself, within Three Weeks after the Day of the Date of this Our Proclamation, in the Manner herein-after mentioned, with such Persons, and in such Districts, as herein-after are mentioned; that is to say,

All Aliens residing within the City of London shall so register themselves with the Lord Mayor of the said City:

All Aliens residing in the City and Liberties of Westminster, or elsewhere within the Bills of Mortality, except the City of London, or residing within Ten Miles of the City of London, shall so register themselves with the Magistrates of the Seven Publick Offices, in Queen Square Westminster, Great Marlborough Street, Hatton Garden, Lambeth Street Whitechapel, Worship Street Shoreditch, Union Hall Southwark, and High Street Shadwell:

All Aliens residing out of the Districts aforesaid, and within any Cities or Corporate Towns, or within the Jurisdiction of the Magistrates of such Cities or Corporate Towns respectively, shall so register themselves with the Mayor or other Chief Magistrate of each of such Cities or Corporate Towns respectively:

And all Aliens residing in other Parts of the Kingdom shall so register themselves with some Justice of the Peace for the County or Place where such Aliens respectively shall reside.

And We do further require and command all Aliens who shall come into this Kingdom, after the Date of this Our Proclamation, to register himself or herself in Manner herein-after mentioned, within One Week after every such Alien shall have landed in this Kingdom, with the Mayor or Chief Magistrate of the Port or Place where such Alien shall land in this Kingdom, or in Default of any such Magistrate, with the Collector of the Customs of the Port in or nearest to which every such Alien shall land.

And We do further require and command every such Alien as aforesaid, for the Purpose of obtaining such Licence as aforesaid, to deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the Person with whom such Alien is hereby required to register himself or herself as aforesaid, a full and true Account, in Writing, of his or her Name, Age, Rank, Occupation or Profession, and where such Alien was born, and where such Alien last resided beyond the Seas before his or her last Arrival in this Kingdom, and when such Alien last arrived in this Kingdom, and at what Place.

And We do hereby authorize and appoint the said Lord Mayor, and such Mayors and Chief Magistrates, and other Magistrates and Collectors of the Customs as aforesaid respectively, to receive such Accounts as aforesaid, and do require and command them respectively to cause the original Account to be transmitted to Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for the Purpose of obtaining Our Royal Licence to reside within this Kingdom, from the said Secretary, whom We do hereby authorize and appoint to grant such Licences, or



from such other Person or Persons whom We shall, from Time to Time, likewise authorize and appoint to grant such Licences.

And We do further authorize and require the said Lord Mayor, and every other such Magistrate or Officer as aforesaid, to whom any such Account shall be delivered as aforesaid, to grant, under his Hand and Seal, to the Alien delivering such Account, a Provisional Licence to such Alien to reside within this Kingdom, under such Restrictions as shall appear fit, during the Time so allowed to such Alien for obtaining a Licence as aforesaid.

And We do further declare, That this Our Proclamation shall not extend to require any Alien to deliver such Account, and obtain such Licence as aforesaid, who is or shall be exempted from the Obligation to deliver such Account by Our Proclamation or Order in Council, or by Special Warrant from One of Our Principal Secretaries of State.

And We do further declare, That, according to the Provisions in the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament, no Foreign Ambassador, or other Publick Minister, duly authorized, nor the Domestic Servant of any such Foreign Ambassador or Publick Minister, registered as such according to the Directions of the Laws in Force for that Purpose, or being actually attendant on such Ambassador or Minister, is to be deemed an Alien within the Meaning of the said Act.

And We also declare, That the Provisions in the said Act do not affect any Alien, in respect of any Act done, or omitted to be done, who shall make it appear that he or she was not above the Age of Fourteen Years at the Time when such Act was so done or omitted to be done.

And We do further declare, That it is by the said Act provided, that all such Licences, and Allowance of Time to obtain Licences as aforesaid, shall be given without Fee or Reward, and shall be subject to no Duty or Charge whatsoever.

And We do further declare and make known, That every Alien who shall be found at large in Great Britain, after the Time by this Our Proclamation limited for his or her obtaining Our Royal Licence to reside in this Kingdom, will be liable to Imprisonment for any Time not exceeding One Year, or to Transportation beyond the Seas for any Time not exceeding Seven Years, unless such Alien shall have obtained such Licence to reside in this Kingdom, or Allowance of Time unexpired to obtain the same, or shall be exempted from the Obligation to deliver such Account as aforesaid by the said Act, or by Our Proclamation or Order in Council, or by Special Warrant from One of Our Principal Secretaries of State.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Fifth Day of July, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.
