MEMORANDUM.

Lieutenant Edmund Rolleston, of the 85th Foot, is superseded, not having joined the Regiment since his Appointment.

Dublin-Castle, August 14, 1798.

SUNDAY being the Anniversary of the Birth of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. Saturday Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and every other Demonstration of Joy, throughout the City.

Whitehall, August 18, 1798.

Whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty by the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on Monday the 30th Ultimo, the Blenheim, Greenland Ship, belonging to the Port of Kingston-upon-Hull, William Mitchenson, Master, on her Arrival in Whitebooth Roads, refused to bring to on the Signal of His Majesty's Ship Nonfuch, and persisted in such Refusal notwithstanding several Shots were fired for the Purpose of enforcing Obedience; that being afterwards surrounded, on her Arrival at the Entrance of the Haven of the said Port, by several Boats from His Majesty's Ships Nonfuch, Nautilus, and Redoubt, (sent for the Purpose of boarding her,) the Crew of the said Greenland Ship, on One of the Boats coming alongside, fired several Shots into her, and violently threw several Spears, Capstern Bars, Handspikes, and other offensive Weapons, and also several large Iron Shots, at and among the Crew of the said Boat; in consequence whereof Richard Bell, Master's Mate, and William Burnock and John Sykes, Seamen, belonging to His Majesty's said Ship Nonfuch, were dangerously wounded, and others much bruised; and the Boats being by this outrageous Conduct repulsed, the Crew of the said Greenland Ship got on Shore and absconded; since which the said William Burnock and John Sykes, have died of the Wounds they received, and the Coroners Inquests have returned Verdicts of Wilful Murder against Persons unknown:

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of the atrocious Murders above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the Offenders (except such as actually gave the Mortal Strokes to the said Burnock and Sykes) who shall dis-

cover his or their Accomplices therein, so that they or any of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

Pratt is 46 Years of Age, was born at Sunderland, is 5 Feet 7½ Inches high, has Black Hair, and a Scar on his Nose. Sommison is 23 Years of Age, was born at Shetland, is 5 Feet 5 Inches high, and has Brown Hair.
