SIR, EREWITH you will receive a Copy of a Letter from Sir Edward Pellew, of His Majesty's Ship Indefatigable, addressed to Vice-Admiral Sir Alan Gardner, stating the Capture of the French National Corvette La Vaillante.

BRIDPORT.

Indefatigable at Sea, August 8, 1798. SIR, Have great Pleasure in communicating to you the Capture of the French National Corvette La Vaillante, commanded by the Lieutenant de Vailfeau La Porte, mounting Twenty Guns, Nine Pounders, pierced for Twenty-two, and manned with One Hundred and Seventy-five Men.

This Ship failed from Rochefort the 1st, and

from L'Isle de Rhé the 4th Instant, with Twenty-five banished Priests, Twenty-seven Convicts, and Madame Rovere and Family, for Cayenne. We fell in with her at Day-break on the 7th, between Bourdeaux and the Isle of Rhé, and the Chace continued Twenty-four Hours, when she struck after firing a few Guns. She is of large Dimensions, only Eighteen Months old, Coppered and Copper fastened, salls fast, and will, I trust, be found sit for His Majesty's Service.

Whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty by the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Kight Honorable the Loras Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on Monday the 30th Ultimo, the Blenheim, Greenland Ship, belonging to the Port of Kingston-upon-Hull, William Mitchenson, Master, on her Arrival in Whitebooth Roads, refused to bring to on the Signal of His Majesty's Ship Nonfuch, and perfifled in fuch Refusal not withstanding several Shot were fired for the Purpose of ensoring Obedience; that being afterwards furrounded, on her Arrival at the Entrance of the Haven of the fail Port, by feveral Boats from His Mäjesty's Ships Nonfuch, Nautilus, and from His Majefly's Ships Nonfuch, Nautilus, and Redoubt, (fent for the Purpose of boarding ber,) the Crew of the said Greenland Ship, on One of the Boats coming alongside, fired several Shot into her, and violently threw several Spears, Capstern Bars, Handspikes, and other offensive Weapons, and also several large Iron Shot, at and among the Crew of the said Boat; in consequence whereof Richard Bell, Master's Mate, and William Burnock and John Sykes, Seamen, belonging to His Majesty's said Ship Nonsuch, were dangerously wounded, and others much bruised; and the Boats being by this outrageous Condust repulsed, the Grew of the said Greenland Ship got on Shore and absconded; since which Greenland Ship got on Shore and absconded; since which the faid William Burnock and John Sykes, have died of the Wounds they received, and the Coroners Inquests have returned Verdicts of Wilful Murder against Persons unknown:

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of the atrocious Murders above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One or more of the Offenders (except such as actually gave the Mortal Strokes to the Said Burnock and Sykes) who shall discover his or their Accomplices therein, so that they or any of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof PORTLAND.

And the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty do bereby offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons (except such as were actually concerned in the said Murders) who shall apprehend or cause to be apprehended any of the said Offenders, to be paid on the Conviction of any One or more of them by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy.
