PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by the unjust Aggreffion of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Govern-ment in France, now in Hostility with His Majesty; many Parts of Italy have been forcibly taken Pol-feffion of, and the Ancient Governments thereof sub-rested and New Components are the under the verted, and New Governments erected, under the Influence of their Councils, for the Purpole of aiding more effectually their Defigns against the Common Interests of Europe, and specially for the Profecution of their Hofile Intentions against the Commerce, Navigation, and Property of His Majefty's faithful Subjects: And whereas divers Acts, injurious to the jult Rights of His Majefty and to the Interefts of thefe Kingdoms, have in confe-quence been committed; His Majefty is pleafed to declare (by and with the Advice of His Privy Council), That fuch Parts of the Coafts of the Mediterranean as are occupied by the Arms of the faid Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France, or are subject to the Government of Persons acting notorioufly under their Influence and Direction, and especially the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and those of the Territory of the Pope, shall be con-fidered as in a State of Hostility with His Majesty; and all His Majefty's Subjects and others are re-quired to treat, and confider the Inhabitants and Subjects thereof as His Majefty's Enemies.

Extract of a Letter from the Right Honorable Lord Brid-port, K.B. Admiral of the White, Sc. to Evan Ne-pean, Efq; dated on board His Majefly's Ship Royal George, at Sea, the 1st of September, 1798. SIR.

HErewith you will receive, for their Lordships Information, the Copy of a Letter of the 31ft Ult. from Captain Stopford, of His Majefty's Ship Phaeton, flating the Capture of the French Privateer Ship Le Mercure. I am, Sir, &c. &c. BRIDPORT.

Phaeton, at Sea,

My Lord, 31*ft August*, 1798. Have the Honor to inform your Lordships, that this Day His Majefty's Ship under my Command, in Company with the Anfon, captured a French Ship Privateer of Eighteen Guns, (pierced for Twenty,) and One Hundred and Thirty-two Men, called Le Mercure: She failed from Bourdeaux Yefterday, bound on a Cruize, is quite a new Veffel, Copper-bottomed and fastened.

B Y Letters received at this Office from the Ho-norable Captain De Courcy, of His Majefty's Ship Magnanime, dated the 21ft and 25th Ultimo, addreffed to Evan Nepean, Elq; it appears that on the 16th of that Month he had fallen in with and captured La Colombe French Privateer, of Twelve Guns and Sixty-four Men, quite a new Veffel, Coppered, Copper-fastened, and a very fast Sailer; had been only Four Days from Bayonne, bound to the Weft Indies. That on the 24th following, at Two P. M. Two Ships of War were obferved fleering to the S. E. under a Crowd of Sail, which proved to be His Majefty's Ship Naiad, Captain Pierrepont, in Chace of a French Frigate. At Five P. M. the Two British Ships neared the Enemy, who, after a well-directed Fire for the Space of One Hour from her Stern-Chace Guns, at the Naiad, ftruck, and was immediately taken Poffer-fion of. She proves to be La Decade, commanded by Le Citoyen Villeneau, manned with Three Hundred and Thirty-fix Men, and pierced for Fortyfour Guns, Ten of which however had been landed at Cayenne, from whence fhe had just returned. Eaptain Pierrepont makes the ftrongeft acknowledgments of the Ardor by which his Officers and Men were animated during an anxious Chace of Thirty-two Hours, in conftant Expectation of Battle, and moft particularly of the Services which he ex-perienced from his First Lieutenant Mr. Marshall.

La Sophie is a very fine Ship, quite new, and well adapted for His Majefty's Service, being an extraordinary fast Sailer; she having been chased Eight different Times during her last Cruize by our Ships of War, and

each time escaped by fuperior Sailing. The May Flower, of New York, from Lisbon to London, taken by Le Telemaque French Cutter Privateer.
