-The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by the unjuft Aggreffion of the Perfons exercifing the Powers of Govern-ment in France, now in Hofility with His Majefty, many Parts of Italy have been forcibly taken Polfeffion of, and the Ancient Governments thereof fubremon of, and the Ancient Governments thereof lub-verted, and New Governments erected, under the Influence of their Councils, for the Purpofe of aiding more effectually their Defigns against the Common Interests of Europe, and specially for the Profecution of their Hostile Intentions against the Commerce, Navigation, and Property of His Ma-ieffu's faithful Subjects. And whereas divers Afts. jesty's faithful Subjects : And whereas divers Acts, injurious to the just Rights of His Majesty and to the Interests of these Kingdoms, have in confequence been committed; His Majesty is pleased to de-clare (by and with the Advice of His Privy Council), That fuch Parts of the Coafts of the Mediterranean as are occupied by the Arms of the faid Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in France, or are fubject to the Government of Perfons acting notoriously under their Influence and Direction and especially the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and those of the Territory of the Pope, shall be con-fidered as in a State of Hostility with His Majesty; and all His Majefty's Subjects and others are required to treat and confider the Inhabitants and Subjects thereof as His Majefty's Enemies.
