P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the unjust Aggression of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, now in Hostility with His Majesty, many Parts of Italy have been forcibly taken Possession of, and the Ancient Governments thereof subverted, and New Governments erected, under the Influence of their Councils, for the Purpose of aiding more effectually their Designs against the Common Interests of Europe, and Specially for the Prosecution of their Hostile Intentions against the Commerce, Navigation, and Property of His Majesty's faithful Subjects: And whereas divers Acts, injurious to the just Rights of His Majesty and to the Interests of these Kingdoms, have in consequence been committed; His Majesty is pleased to declare (by and with the Advice of His Privy Council), That such Parts of the Coasts of the Mediterranean as are occupied by the Arms of the said Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, or are subject to the Government of Persons acting notoriously under their Influence and Direction, and especially the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and those of the Territory of the Pope, shall be considered as in a State of Hostility with His Majesty; and all His Majesty's Subjects and others are required to treat and consider the Inhabitants and Subjects thereof as His Majesty's Enemies.

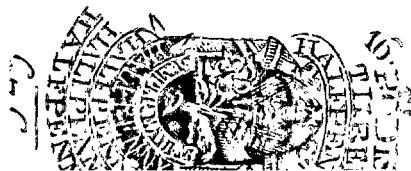

Forth and Clyde Navigation.

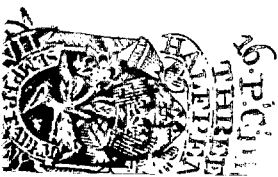
