Whitehall, September 12, 1798. **A** DISPATCH of which the following is a Copy, has been received this Morning from His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, by His Grace the Duke of Portland, one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State.

St. John's Town, County of Long-MY LORD, ford, Sept. 8, 1798. I Have the Satisfaction to inform your Grace, that the French Troops which landed in this Country have furrendered at diferetion, after fuftaining for fome Time an Attack from the Column under General Lake. The Rebels who had joined them were difperfed, and a great Proportion of them killed or taken. I cannot at prefent afcertain the Numbers either of the French or Rebels, but I believe that both were inconfiderable.

I have not had an Opportunity of feeing General Lake fince the Action, and can therefore at prefent give your Grace no further Particulars, than that no Officer was killed or materially wounded.
