Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir Richard Onslow, Bart. to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on board His Majesty's Ship Monarch, Tarmouth Road, September 16, 1798.

BE pleased to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that His Majesty's Ship America has sent into this Port a French Privateer Luggar, called the Hussar, mounting Fourteen Guns, and had on board Thirty-four Men: She belongs to Harfleur, which Place she left the 6th of April last, and put into Norway to refit.
