7 HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-third Day of October next; We, with the Advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued on the faid Twenty-third Day of October, to Tuesday the Sixth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight; and We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the faid Sixth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Sixth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight.

Given at Our Court at Weymouth, the Twentyeighth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THIS Day the Right Honorable William Shaw Lord Cathcart was, by His Majesty's Cominand, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accord ingly.
