A PROCLAMATION,
GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-third Day of October next; We, with the Advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Twenty-third Day of October; to Tuesday the Sixth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight; and We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Sixth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burghesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Sixth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight.

Given at Our Court at Weymouth, the Twenty-eighth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

GOD save the KING.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honorable William Shaw Lord Cathcart was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Whitehall, September 1, 1798.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Charles MacPherson, of Kingston, in the Island of Jamaica, Esq; His Royal Licence and Authority to assume and take the Surname of MacNeal only, in Compliance with the Will of Lachlan MacNeal, late of Kingston, in the Island of Jamaica, Esq; such Declaration and Concession being duly recorded in the College of Arms.

Dublin-Castle, September 28, 1798.

Saturday being the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation, at Noon the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and every other Demonstration of Joy.

PERSONAL LEGACY DUTY.

Stamp-Office, Sept. 7, 1798.

WHEREAS by an Act passed on the 26th Day of April, in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, it is Enacted, "That upon every Legacy, Specific or Pecuniary, of the Value of 20l. or more, given by any Will or Testamentary Instrument of any Person who shall die after the passing of the said Act, out of the Personal Estate of the Person so dying, and also upon the clear Residue of the Personal Estate of every Person who shall so die, whether Testate or Intestate, and leave Personal Estate of the clear Value of 100l. after deducting Debts, Funeral Expences, and other Charges; there shall be raised, levied, and collected, for the Use of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the several Duties, after the Rates, and in Manner therein particularly mentioned."

AND WHEREAS HIS MAJESTY'S COMMISSIONERS FOR MANAGING THE STAMP DUTIES have Reason to believe that the Duties which have become payable under the said Act upon Legacies bequeathed, as well as upon the Residue of the Personal Estate and Effects of many Persons who have died since the said 26th Day of April, the Day of passing the said Act, have not been duly answered and paid, and proper Receipts or Discharges

given for such Legacies and Personal Estate, according to the said Act; and the said Commissioners have also Reason to believe that the Duties imposed by several other Acts on Legacies; and the Residue of Personal Estate, not subject to the Duties imposed by the said Act of the 36th Year of His Majesty's Reign, have not been duly answered and paid, and proper Receipts or Discharges given for such Legacies and Personal Estate, according to the said former Acts; and also according to the said Act of the 36th Year of His Majesty's Reign:

THE COMMISSIONERS ALSO GIVE NOTICE, That by an Act passed in the 37th Year of His Majesty's Reign, It is Enacted, "That every Person who shall Administer the Personal Estate of any Person dying after the passing of the said Act; or any Part thereof, without proving the Will of the Deceased, or taking out Letters of Administration of such Personal Estate within Six Calendar Months after the Death of the Person so dying, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of FIFTY POUNDS, to be recovered as therein is mentioned, One Moiety thereof to His Majesty, and the other to the Person who shall sue for the same."

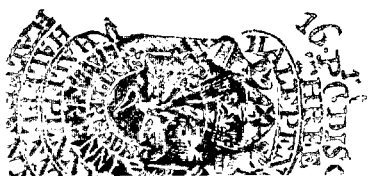
