The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS by an Order in Council dated the Twenty-ninth of August, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-eight, His Majesty was pleased to declare, that the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and those of the Territory of the Pope, should be considered as in a State of Hostility with His Majesty, and to require all His Majesty's Subjects, and others, to treat and confider the Inhabitants and Subjects thereof as His Majesty's Enemies: His Majesty, being determined to take such further Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honor of His Crown, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprifals be granted against the Ships and Goods belonging to the Persons inhabiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa; and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pretended Authority of Governments conflituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, styling themfelves the Ligurian and the Roman Republicks, fo that as well His Majesty's Fleet and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commisfionated by Letters of Marque, or General Reprifals, or otherwise, by His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all Ships, Vessels, and Goods, belonging to the Persons in. habiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pretended Authority of Governments constituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, styling themfelves the Ligurian and the Roman Republicks, and bring the same to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions; and to that End, His Majesty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Ad-

Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorifing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Persons by them empowered and appointed, to issue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprifals to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others, whom the faid Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing, and taking the Ships, Veffels, and Goods belonging to the Persons inhabiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pretended Authority of Governments constituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, styling themselves the Ligurian and Roman Republicks; and; that fuch Powers and Clauses be inserted in the faid Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents: And His Majesty's said Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty, at this Board, authoriting the faid Commissioners for executifig the Office of Lord High Admiral, to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, his Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the feveral Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all, and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprifals, of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same; and according to the Course of Admiralty, and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Goods, as shall belong to the Persons inhabiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pretended Authority of Governments constituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, flyling themselves the Ligurian and the Roman Republicks; and that fuch Powers and Clauses be inserted in the faid Commission as havemiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draught of a been usual, and are according to former Precedents.

And they are likewife to prepare and lay before His Majesty, at this Board, a Draught of such Instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Governments and Plantations, for their Guidance herein; as also another Draught of Instructions for such Ships as shall be commissionated for the Purposes aforementioned.
