For a General Thanksgiving.

WE, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the indifpenfable Duty which We owe to Almighty God for the recent and fignal Interpolition of His good Providence, in Addition to the manifold and ineftimable Benefits which thefe Kingdoms had already received at His Hands, manifested by the Bleffing beftowed on Our Arms in the late memorable Battle, fought in diftant Seas, as well as by the Deliverance of Our Dominions from Invafion and from intefline Commotions, through the Energy and Valour of Our Naval and Military Forces, and the Loyalty and Courage of Our faithful Subjects, which, exerted in a righteous Caufe, it has pleafed the Divine Goodness to crown with Succels, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that a General Thankfgiving to Almighty God, for these His Mercies, be observed throughout England, Wales, and the Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of November next : And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to the Occasion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of Publick Worship, and to take Care for the timely dispersing of the fame throughout their respective Dioceles; and We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Day of Thankfgiving be religioufly obferved by all Our loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of fuf- |

fering fuch Punishment as we may justly inflict upon all fuch who shall contemn or neglect the fame.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentyfourth Day of October, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.
