Having fallen, in the Night before the Action, with His Majefty's Brig Kangaroo, I ordered Cap-tain Brace, from the Anfon's difabled State, to continue in Company, and am much indebted to him for the Services he has rendered me in taking Posseffion of La Loire.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral Peyton, Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Downes to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated 29th October 1798.

SIR,

Herewith inclose, for their Lordships' Informa-tion, a Letter I have received from Captain Chefshyre of His Majesty's Sloop Plover, stating his hav-ing captured a French Schooner Privateer of Ten Carriage Guns and Eight Swivels, that left Calais on Saturday laft in the Forenoon, but had not taken any Thing.

SIR, Plover, at Sea, October 28, 1798. I Beg Leave to acquaint you, for the Information of my Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, that on Sunday Morning the 28th Inftant, I observed a fufpicious Schooner between Three and Four Leagues S. W. of Fairleigh, to which I gave Chafe; at Ten, after firing Five or Six Chafe Guns, fhe ftruck; on boarding found her to be Le Corfair L'Eringobrah, of Ten Carriage Guns and Eight Swivels, viz. Eight Three Pounders, and Two Four Pounders, Part of which the threw overboard ; fhe had between Forty and Fifty Men ; fhe failed from Calais on Saturday Forenoon, had taken nothing.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral Peyton, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships in the Downes, to Evan Nepean, Efg; dated 29th October 1798.

HIS Majefty's Sloop Racoon is just arrived in the Downes, and I herewith enclose a Letter I have received from her Commander, flating his having chafed Three French Lugger Privateers and captured One of them; Le Vigilant, of Twelve Four Pounders, and Two Long Sixes (Fifty-five Men) which foon after funk.

His Majefly's Ship Racoon,

SIR, Downes, Od. 20, 1798. BEG Leave to acquaint you, that at Six A. M. I on this Morning, Blacknefs bearing S. E. by E. Diftance Three Leagues, I difcovered Three large Luggers a-head; immediately made all Sail and gave Chafe; after a running Fire of Two Hours, had the Pleafure to come up with and capture One of them, Le Vigilant Lugger, mounting Twelve Four-pounders and Two Long Sixes, carrying Fifty-five Men, (Six or Seven of which were left on Shore at Boulogne,) commanded by Citizen Muirbaffe. On fending my Boats on board, I found that in confe-uence of her being bull?d in found that in confequence of her being hull'd in feveral Places fhe was finking very faft, which detained me a confiderable Time, (in endeavouring to ftop the Leak,) other-wife I must inevitably have taken another before they could poffibly have reached the Coaft of France. I have the Pleafure to fay that all the Prifoners got fafe on board except those killed by my firing, and every Exertion was used to fave the Vessel, but to no Effect ; at Nine A. M. fhe funk ; fhe was entirely new, had been out Two Cruifes only, and taken nothing. One of the Luggers in Company had captured a Brig, which I observed His Majesty's Sloop the Plover to take Possession of, off Folkestone, at Eleven A. M.
