The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Second of May laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Afhes or Pearl-Afhes (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the Seventh Day of November next; and whereas it is judged expedient, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Seventh Day of November next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave of Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfcitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirtyfourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An * Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been " concerned in advising or carrying into Execution " an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Ma-

" jefty's Treafury respecting the Exportation of Pot-"Afhes or Pearl-Afhes; for preventing Suits in " confequence of the fame; for authorizing His " Majefty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coaftwife of Pot-Aflies or Pearl-Afhes, and for "making further Provisions relative thereto ;" but it is, nevertheles, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East-Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards. before the Entry of the fame shall be made; and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places forwhich they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commillioners, and Ipecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which

they were entered outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.

WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by his to direct, that all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, then arrived, or that fhould thereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Pennfylvania, should make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, to commence and be com-puted from the Day each Ship or Veffel should come to Anchor in the Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and not before; and should strictly conform themfelves, in all Respects, to the Rules and Regulations thereby required to be observed : And whereas His Majelty has received Information, that the malignant and infectious Diforder, of the Nature of the Plague, which exifts in the City of Philadelphia, hath extended itself to the Port of Bofton and New York ; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon order, That the Quarantine, at prefent fublifting upon all Ships and Veffels coming from Philadel-phia, be extended to all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes coming from Boston and New York, or from any of the Ports within the Provinces of Maffachufett's Bay and New York: And His Majefty, with the Advice aforefaid, doth hereby further order, require, and com-mand, that all Ships and Veffels whatfoever coming from Bofton or New York, or from any of the Ports within the Provinces of Maffachufett's Bay and New York, and all Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, on board the fame, that are already arrived, or shall hereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jerley, Guern-

fey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, and do firicitly conform themfelves, in all Refpects, to the Rules and Regulations now in Force, and required to be observed by Ships and Vessels subject to Quarantine: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General, and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary appertain.

W HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly plcafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-two, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, fhould be paid in the Manner thereby di-rected to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy either with the Cantains or Lieuterants of Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers em-ployed on Shore for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioully pleafed, by his faid Proclama-tion, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majeity's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was also gracioully pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majelty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majelty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coalts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this inftant October; and it being judged expedient for His Majelty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of

His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for the Payment of the faid Bounties and Re-and govern themfelves accordingly.

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council, WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth Day of April last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom of any Sort of Rock Salt, will expire upon the Twenty-ninth Day of this inftant October: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Ad-vice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twentyninth Day of this inftant October, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or load or lay on hoard of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or con-veyed out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, any Sort of Rock Salt whatfoever, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Persons " who have been concerned in adviling or carrying " into Execution an Order of His Majefty in " Council respecting the Exportation of Rock "Salt, for preventing Suits in confequence of the Gane, for authorizing His Majefty to prohibit the
Exportation or carrying Coaftwife of Rock Salt,
and for making further Provisions relative thereto :" His Majefty, neverthelefs, by the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit to order, that nothing herein contained shall prevent Rock Salt being carried Coaftwife, under the ufual Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions, nor the Exportation of the fame to Ireland, or to any other of His Majelty's Dominions, under the ufual Conditions and Regulations, and upon Security being given by the Exporter, and two other Perfons, (of whom the Mafter of the Veffel shall be one,) by Bond, in fuch Penalty as shall be directed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that the faid Rock Salt shall be ex-ported to fome Port or Place in His Majesty's Dominions, and none other, and that a Certificate shall be produced, within Six Months from the Date of the Bond, if fuch Rock Salt shall be entered out for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe; and within Twelve Months, if for any Part of His Majefty's Dominions in America or the Weft Indies ; and within Eighteen Months, if for any of the British Settlements or Factories in Afia or Africa, under the Hand of the Principal Officer of the Customs at the Port or Place where fuch Rock Salt shall be fo landed ; - and if there shall be no Officer of the Cuf-

toms, then under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place, testifying that the faid Rock Salt has been duly landed at the Port or Place for which the fame was entered out --- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treafury, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

W E, your Majefty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of this our Provin-cial Synod, eagerly embrace the first Opportunity in our Power of expreffing our heartfelt Congratu-lations on the fignal Victories obtained by your Majefty's Fleets at the Mouth of the Nile and off the Coaft of Ireland.

We look up to a kind Providence with Gratitude for this remarkable Interpolition, which has effectu-ally fruftrated the ambitious Projects of our inveterate Foes; and which, we fervently hope, will effen-tially contribute to bring back to their Allegiance and Duty those deluded Subjects of a Sister Kingdom, who, infligated by the infidious Enemies of our happy Conflitution, and relying on Foreign Succours, have taken up Arms against their Sovereign and their Country.
