And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerk, whom We ordain to fee the fame published;

and We appoint them to fend Copies thereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds; that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jefty's Order in Council of the Second of May last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the Seventh Day of November next; and whereas it is judged expedient, that the faid Prohi-bition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Seventh Day of November next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot-Ash or Pearl-Ash, without Leave or Permisfion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirtyfourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An "Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have been " concerned in advising or carrying into Execution " an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Ma-"jefty's Treafury refpecting the Exportation of Pot-"Afnes or Pearl-Afnes; for preventing Suits in "confequence of the fame; for authorizing His "Majefty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying "Coaftwife of Pot-Afnes or Pearl-Afnes, and for " making further Provisions relative thereto ;" but it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be con-flrued to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the Welf Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefly's Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man; or to His Majefly's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Ifland of Newfound-land on to His Majefly's Further land, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East-Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do firft

the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards. before the Entry of the fame shall be made ; and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, fhewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral Lord Viscount Duncan, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on board the Kent, Yarmouth Roads, November 5, 1798.

I Have the Satisfaction to inclose you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter I received last Night from Captain King, of His Majesty's Ship Sirius, acquainting me of his having captured Two Dutch Frigates, in which he has displayed equal Spirit and Address.

My Lord,

Sirius, Grimfby-Roads, November 1, 1798.

I Have the Honor to inform your Lordfhip, that in purfuance of Orders I received from Vice-Admiral Sir Richard Onflow, Bart. I parted Company with the Fleet on the Evening of the 23d Inftant, to reconnoitre the Force of the Enemy in the Texel. At Eight A. M. on the following Morning, the Texel bearing S. by E. Ten Leagues, I fell in with the Two Dutch Frigates named in the Margin *, at that Time about Two Miles Diftance from each other.

Paffing within Gun Shot of the Leewardmoft of them, I flood on until I could (upon Tacking) nearly fetch the Weathermoft, (the Waakzaamheid,) my Object being to prevent their Junction; and by this Means, that being accomplifhed, I had the Satisfaction to cut off the latter, and bring her to about Nine o'Clock, when fhe hauled down her Colours and fired a Gun to Leeward; as foon as the Prifoners were exchanged, I made Sail after the other, and although nearly out of Sight, I had
