Copy of a Letter from Captain Columbine, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated Haflings, November 13, 1798.

I AM to acquaint you, that this Morning a French Privateer having appeared off this Place, and Mr. Wenham having offered himfelf and Cutter, the Lion, to go after her, I put on board her as many of the Sea Fencibles as I thought neceffary, chafed, and after a little Firing, in which One Frenchman was killed, we took and brought her into this Road. She is the Succefs of Cherbourg, Nicholas Dubois, Master, with Four Guns and Twenty-four Men: Had been out Four Days without making any Cap-ture. I beg Leave to add, that the Haltings Men came forward on the Occasion with the greatest Zeal and Readiness.

To this iplendid Atchievement, in conjunction with other fignal Succeffes of your Majefty's Navy, and aided by the loyal and gallant Spirit difplayed by your People, we afcribe the Enjoyment of our internal Security and the Prefervation of our incflimable Conflictution: And we join in Thanksgiving to Almighty God, who, we trult, has thereby defeated the hostile and ruinous Designs of the Enemy against your Majefty's Territories both at Home and Abroad,
