Honorable Sirs,

Beg Leave to inform your Honors, that being a cruizing with the Badger Cutter on the Morning of the 5th Inftant; I fell in with and captured between Folkstone and Dungenness, a French Lugger Privateer of Four Carriage Guns, and manned with Eighteen Men, called the Calaisen, Citoyen Jaques Guillaume Lamey, Commander, of and from Calais, out Eighteen Hours, and had captured nothing; quite New, being her first Cruize. I have put in here with the Prize owing to its blowing very strong from the Southward, and as soon as it moderates, I shall proceed to Dover with her.
