WE your Majefty's moft dutiful and loyal Sub jects beg leave to approach your Royal Perfon with our moit fincere Congratulations on the Victories lately obtained over the Power of France by your Majefty's Fleets.

The Confequences neceffarily flowing from thefe decifive Victories, will, we truft, be to important, that while the almolt unexampled Valour and Skill difplayed on thefe Occafions by your Majefty's Forces are moft gratefully, admired, we not only look forward to the immediate Safety of the Britifh Empire from the Attacks of an implacable Foe, with which it has been threatened and affailed, but likewife to the Continuance of that Syftem of religious Belief and well-ordered Government fo long eftat blifhed in Europe.-Animated by the fuccefsful Stand which your Majefty has made. in Defance of the Independance and Rights of your Crown, we hope that other Powers will exert a fimilar Spirit and Perfeverance.
